#### Part 2. Expenditure Plan details.

(a) Describe the Program(s) and/or Project(s) to be funded, including how the funds will be used, for what purposes, the location(s) to be served, and what COVID-related needs will be addressed:

Window Rock Unified School District is requesting \$1,067,370 for the remediation of a trash dump on school district land leased from the Navajo Nation. The land was leased to WRUSD in 1983. The trash dump site is being mitigated as it may be hazardous to children, school staff and the community. This project will aid in the response to address rural public health impacts. It is the intention of the school district to locate a new athletic complex, complete with a stadium, football field, track, related track and field facilities, locker rooms bathrooms and concession stand areas on the site.

These new facilities will also serve as an outdoor classroom space for students participating in Physical Education classes during the academic school day. The use of an outdoor classroom space will help mitigate the spread of the COVID-19 virus. Physical Education classrooms tend to be large in enrollment filling indoor spaces such as gyms. Large crowds confined to enclosed spaces tend to exceptionally spread the virus. The use of an outdoor classroom space by the students will provide an opportunity for social distancing and fresh outside air while exercising. The Window Rock Unified School District places the health, safety, and security of our students as a top priority. We believe that these new facilities will achieve this goal, as we do our part in helping to keep our students healthy and mitigate the spread of the Covid-19 virus.

(b) Explain how the Program or Project will benefit the Navajo Nation, Navajo communities, or the Navajo People:

Almost 100% of the students who will utilize the new facilities are Navajo. Window Rock Unified School District employes Navajo personnel. Adjacent to the existing trash dump location is a traiter park, BIA forestry, NTUA and Navajo Nation office buildings. Trash dump mitigation and related clean-up efforts help meet existing EPA standards for wastewater and the protection of ground water for not only the school district but the surrounding community, businesses, and Navajo Nation services in the area. It is the intention of the Window Rock Unified School District to allow community functions to occur in the new facilities. We want to be the center of our community for Powwows, Treaty Day celebrations, and other related cultural events that occur in our community. Highlighting our traditions and our culture is an important aspect of educating our student population about what it means to be a Window Rock Scout and what it means to be a PROUD Navajo. These facilities belong not just to the school district, they belong to the community.

#### WHEREAS:

- A. The WRUSD is a political subdivision of the State of Arizona located on the Navajo Nation; and
- B. The Navajo Nation is sovereign a nation; and
- C. The WRUSD is currently building an athletic complex at Window Rock High School which is located on leased Navajo Nation lands; and
- D. The athletic complex will benefit both students and community members within the Navajo Nation; and
- E. Removal and remediation of trash that has accumulated on the site over the course of multiple decades is a requirement for the construction of the new athletic complex; and
- F. Both the WRUSD and the Navajo Nation have an interest in the health and safety of WRUSD students and Navajo Nation community members; and
- G. Both the WRUSD and the Navajo Nation have an interest in promoting healthy recreational activity in the community; and
- H. Both WRUSD and the Navajo Nation desire to promote academic, community education, athletics, and cultural activities at the athletic complex that are beneficial for the community and Nation as a whole.

#### **NOW THEREFORE:**

WRUSD School Board supports the ARPA application submission of \$1,067,370 for the removal and remediation of the trash site.

The number also provides academic authority granted by the Arizona State Department of Education and the Arizona State Board of Education for the issuance of a certified Arizona High School Diploma.
