To Whom it May Concern,

Please find the attached documents for our project proposal requesting \$3 million to design and construct a new Navajo Natural Heritage Program (NNHP) Building in Window Rock, AZ. The purpose of the building is to provide a permanent, centralized location for 10-12 primary staff, field equipment, and IT infrastructure, for NNHP to more efficiently conduct biological reviews. Currently, NNHP staff share office space in two separate buildings in Window Rock and others work remotely because of the lack of space. The proposed building will provide office space for all staff in one place allowing for increased productivity, collaboration, and access to the public.

This initiative is needed now more than ever, as the number of project and homesite lease biological clearance requests is at an all-time high in response to the COVID-19 Pandemic. In order to keep up with the demand for biological clearances, NNHP needs a dedicated building for its staff to operate at the highest capacity. Once the building is complete, there will be immediate improvements in the time it takes to receive biological clearances, which will allow for more homesite leases, water/electricity utility connections, and infrastructure projects across the Navajo Nation.

If awarded, the NNHP Manager will assume a majority of responsibilities with assistance from the Forester and other staff.
(e) Explain who will be responsible for operations and maintenance costs for the Project once completed, and how such costs will be funded prospectively:
The Navajo Natural Heritage Program will be responsible for operations and maintenance costs for the project once complete. NNHP receives annual funding through a Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) 638 contract.

3.5 Public Sector Capacity: Administrative Needs - The COVID-19 Pandemic shed light on many of the Navajo Nations shortcomings with infrastructure. As a result NNHP has been inundated with homesite and project biological clearance requests as funding has become available to address the lack of infrastructure. NNHP was able to hire new employees to help with the growing back log of requests, however, we now lack the office space to house the current staff. Funding for a new NNHP Building would allow the entire staff to be centrally located and expedite the biological clearance process.
5.15 Drinking Water: Other Water Infrastructure - The new NNHP Building will provide NNHP staff a permanent, centralized location to work, allowing them to work more efficiently. Ultimately this will expedite the Biological Clearance process required for water and other utilities to be constructed to homesites or larger water infrastructure projects to commence.
2.23 Strong Healthy Communities: Demolition and Rehabilitation of Properties - The building site for this project is located at the Navajo Nation Fairgrounds in Window Rock, AZ. The site has several abandoned foundations of demolished buildings. These foundations would be removed and replaced with the new NNHP Building as a part of this project (see site map in attached land relinquishment letter).

#### Part 2. Expenditure Plan Details

(a) Describe the Program(s) and/or Project(s) to be funded, including how the funds will be used, for what purposes, the location(s) to be served, and what COVID-related needs will be addressed:

We are proposing to design and build a Navajo Natural Heritage Program (NNHP) Building in Window Rock, AZ, consisting of office space to house 10-12 primary NNHP staff, field equipment, and IT infrastructure. The primary intent of this building is to centralize NNHP staff responsible for monitoring the status of threatened and endangered plant and animal species, and staff responsible for applying this data to biological reviews, and issuing Biological Resource Clearance Forms (BRCF) for homesites and land-use projects required before projects can commence. Currently, staff share office space in two separate buildings in Window Rock and others work remotely. This office building will increase the productivity and efficiency of NNHP staff and allow them to increase the rate of projects reviewed and clearances issued. Ultimately, this will decrease the administrative time needed for community members to begin building their homes, obtain electric, water, and gas utilities from NTUA; and for developers to begin important infrastructure projects such as buildings, roads, pipelines, and solar arrays.

We are requesting \$3 million in funding to hire an architect and general contractor for full design-build services for the project. We estimate, through consultation with Navajo Capital Projects Management Department (see attached example floor plan cost breakdown), requiring an approximately a 3,000 – 4,000 sqft building for our programs size. The proposed building will be constructed in Window Rock, AZ at the Navajo Nation Fairgrounds, we have a 1-acre lot relinquished to Navajo Nation Dept. of Fish and Wildlife (see attached Land Relinquishment Letter).

The proposed NNHP Building will expedite the biological clearance process required to obtain a homesite lease, including obtaining fundamental utilities such as water and electricity which the COVID-19 Pandemic exposed as lacking in many Navajo Communities. Furthermore, the biological clearance process will be faster for all projects, Navajo Nation-wide, directly addressing COVID-19 needs such as infrastructure projects funded through the CARES Act, Light Up Navajo, and soon to be American Rescue Plan Act.

## (b) Explain how the Program or Project will benefit the Navajo Nation, Navajo Communities, or the Navajo People:

Unfortunately, it is common knowledge that acquiring biological clearance for a homesite or other land-use, infrastructure projects is a tedious process than can take months if not years to complete. Despite the diligent and hard work of our staff, NNHP remains a major bottleneck of the homesite lease and land-use (biological) clearance process. Despite the vital roles NNHP plays in protecting Navajo Nation plant and wildlife resources, while facilitating community and economic development, the program itself lacks a permanent and dedicated facility to house its many operations and staff. Limited and disjointed office space leads to poor productivity among current staff, meaning slow processing times of homesite leases and biological reviews. The Lack of space also forces many staff members to work remotely which has been shown to significantly decrease productivity and

collaboration. Finally, recruiting and hiring qualified staff suffers from the lack of dedicated office space for potential hires.

The Navajo Nation, Navajo Communities, and Navajo People will benefit from expedited biological clearances for homesites and infrastructure projects. This includes for basic, fundamental utilities (NTUA requires a homesite lease to install utilities) and for larger public and private sector economic and community development, infrastructure projects on the Navajo Nation. Furthermore, a centralized NNHP Building will provide a single place for the public and project managers to visit with questions, concerns, documents, etc.

Please find the attached letter requesting the relinquishment of 1 acre of land at the Navajo Nation Fairgrounds in Window Rock, AZ. The land is located on the northwest corner of the Fairgrounds and is a part of the tract withdrawn in Navajo Nation Council Resolution RCMA-38-03.

Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife (NNDFW) is requesting that the land be relinquished from the current land manager to NNDFW. The purpose of the land relinquishment is to facilitate current and future construction projects for two NNDFW programs, the Diné Native Plants Program and the Navajo Natural Heritage Program. In 2024, a 2,500 sqft seed bank and greenhouse facility will be constructed at the site to house the operations of the Diné Native Plants Program.

Additionally, pending future funding, the site will be the home of a 3,000 - 4,000 sqft office building for the Navajo Natural Heritage Program. NNDFW staff are currently seeking several funding opportunities to develop this much-needed headquarters for the Navajo Natural Heritage Program staff.

Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife (NNDFW) is requesting that 1-acre of withdrawn land of the Navajo Nation Fairgrounds in Window Rock, AZ be relinquished from the current land manager to NNDFW. The purpose of the land relinquishment is to facilitate current and future construction projects for two NNDFW programs, the Diné Native Plants Program and the Navajo Natural Heritage Program. In 2024, a seed bank and greenhouse for the Diné Native Plants Program will be constructed on the site (see attached map for approximate location and extent). Additionally, staff are currently seeking several funding opportunities to construct a much-needed office building for the Navajo Natural Heritage Program.

In addition to the land relinquishment, we are requesting access to the western gate to the Fairgrounds along Highway 264. We will need access to this entrance for the duration of construction in 2024 and thereafter, as this will serve as the main entrance to our facility. We will facilitate the permitting process through Arizona Department of Transportation to obtain an official encroachment permit in order to utilize the entrance throughout the year.

Furthermore, we will work with fair management to ensure our facility and operations will not interfere with the Fairgrounds operation during the Navajo Nation Fair, Fourth of July Celebration, or other annual events. Diné Native Plants Program staff are willing to participate in such events to provide outreach and education on native plants and ecological restoration on the Navajo Nation.


