RESOLUTION OF TORREON/STAR LAKE CHAPTER TSL #04/2023-44

AMENDING & SUPPORTING THE REQUEST AND APPROVAL OF THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR TORREON/STAR LAKE CHAPTER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,100,292.50 FOR THE FOLLOWING CHAPTER PROJECTS LISTING OF THE TORREON/STAR LAKE CHAPTER.

WHEREAS:

- The Torreon/Star Lake Chapter is a recognized chapter of the Navajo Nation established and recognized by the Navajo
 Nation Council as a foundation of the Navajo Nation government vested with the authority to plan and implement
 projects in the best interest of the community. See generally 2 N.N.C.4021 et seq. and 26 N.N.C. §102; and
- Pursuant 2 N.N.C. § 102 (a), the Navajo Nation Council is governing the body of the Navajo Nation; and by resolution CAP-34-98, the Navajo Nation Council approved the "Local Governance Act" wherein the Navajo Nation Council delegated governmental authority to the Chapters of the Navajo Nation to address matters of local concern with Navajo Law, Custom, and Tradition; and
- The Torreon/Star Lake Chapter is a non-certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation established and recognized by the Navajo Nation Council as a foundation of the Navajo Nation government vested with the authority to plan and implement projects in the best interest of the community. See generally 2 N.N.C. 4021 et seq. and 26 N.N.C. §103; and
- 4. The Torreon/Star Lake Chapter realized the Navajo Nation Council approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region Project Plans approved by the Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C)(10),(11), and (12); and
- The purpose of the NNFRF and the Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plans, "Delegate Region" shall mean all the Navajo Nation Chapters, both LGA Certified and Non-LGA Chapters and Townships represented by a Navajo Nation Council Delegate; and
- 6. The Torreon/Star Lake Chapter realized the Fiscal Recovery Funds costs must be incurred by December 31, 2024, meaning that the Navajo Nation must obligate FRF funds by that date. Treasury's Final Rule provides that "incurred" shall have the same meaning given to "financial obligation" under the Uniform Guidance at 2 CFR 200.1: "Financial obligations, when referencing a recipient's or sub-recipient's use of funds under a Federal award, means orders placed for property and services, contracts and sub-awards made, and similar transactions that require payment"; and
- The Torreon/Star Lake Chapter realized the Fiscal Recovery Fund period performance runs from March 3, 2021, until December 31, 2026, meaning that all FRF-funded projects must be completed, and funds must be fully expended by December 31, 2026; and

8. The Torreon/Star Lake Chapter recognizes the need for these projects to improve the quality of life for its residents while combating and recovering from COVID-19 and the number of requests is only a fraction of what the chapter needs to substantially improve the community of Torreon/Star Lake Chapter for a safe, healthy, and habitable home environment.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. Requesting, Accepting, Supporting and Approving CJN-290-22, American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding in the amount of \$1,100,292.50 million for the Torreon/Star Lake Chapter to be utilized for Torreon Priority One (1) Septic Repair/Replace Failed Septic Systems & Clean Out, and Priority Two (2) House Wiring and Rewiring of Older Homes, and Affirming that Torreon/Star Lake Chapter will only use awarded Funds in compliance with the American Rescue Plan Act Regulations and all other applicable Navajo Nation and Federal Laws Regulation; and
- 2. The Torreon/Star Lake Chapter hereby approves and identified projects for the American Rescue Plan Act and prioritized these projects as follows:
