



- The Round Rock Chapter Government held dialogue with membership numerous times to discuss needs and effects experienced from Covid-19; AND
- The Covid-19 Pandemic had various effects on membership, across the Navajo Nation, and many counties; AND
- The effected we told to take walks, gatherings were disallowed unless it is open space, such as outside, a Park would benefit both and to promote the many underlying health issues raised during this trying times; AND

- 8. The basic food and cleaning necessities was scarce, the C-store can benefit the locals to not have to travel afar for basic needs, even travelers were restricted to travel to border towns; AND
- 9. The Navajo Nation Standing Committees and Grazing Representative has been discussing and passing resolution directing Chapters to establish a Community Cemetery; Lukachukai St. Isabel Catholic Church has been sending letters requesting for our Chapter to take action; AND
- 10. Economic Development is a must for our Community and it helps Operators/Business to establish within our Community with upgraded lagoons.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. 

## RESPECTFULLY REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES TECHINICAL, CONSTRUCTION, AND OPERATIONS BRANCH TO EVALUATE THE ROUND ROCK IRRIGATION SYSTEM FOR REHABILITATION, COST ESTIMATE AND PLAN OF ACTION

#### WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act (26 N.N.C.), Chapter 1, Subchapter 1, Section 3 (A) the Round Rock Chapter Government, is a certified Chapter Organization, which elects a Delegate to the Navajo Nation Council. The Chapter is also listed as being certified at Part 1, Section 10, of 11 N.N.C., the "Navajo Nation Election Code; AND
- Pursuant to the same "Act", Chapter 1, Subchapter 1, Section 1 (B-1), the Navajo Nation Council; delegates to our Chapter, governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Law, including custom and tradition; AND
- Section 1 (B-2), authorizes our Chapter, to improve Community decision making; allow us to excel
  and flourish; enable our Navajo Leaders to lead towards a prosperous future, and improve the
  strength and sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Our Chapter is compelled to govern with
  responsibility and accountability to us, the Local Citizens; AND
- 4. Pursuant to the Federal "Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L.; 93-638), as amended, our Chapter Government, is entitled and supported to initiate plans and make recommendations, requests, and thus; determine the promotion, protection, and preservation of the general welfare of our Community People, as well as the Navajo Nation; AND
- 5. Every Spring and Summer, our main irrigation canal needs cleaning out and especially, at the location of the main diversion site; AND
- 6. The control tunnel needs to be leveled or sloped to downstream to prevent clogging; AND
- 7. The main diversion gate and two filtering gates need to be changed out; AND
- 8. The culverts need to be replaced and lowered; AND
- 9. These Culverts need to be lowered because the water upstream gets too heavy causing the canal to break; AND
- 10. The culvert under the Route 12 also need to be lowered but B.I.A. Roads Department needs to do it; AND

- 11. The Whole canal needs to be widened; AND
- 12. The dug out silt on the north side of the canal needs to be cut down or lowered; AND
- 13. Moreover, we need to re-fill and restock our lake with fish; AND
- 14. Thousands or maybe even a million plus dollars were spent by the "Safety of Dams, to renovate the dam"; AND
- 15. Thousands and maybe even millions plus gallons of water just ran through our Community all these years; AND
- 16. This Project, Earthen Dam and Wind mill repair requests were sent to Window Rock/Ft. Defiance Water Resources Department, but to no avails, this day; AND
- 17. We know that funds were and still are appropriated for the aforementioned projects; AND
- 18. The Round Rock Community was once well-known for prosperous Agricultural activities in both the in farming and livestock managements; AND
- 19. We have some families that still use the water to irrigate and plant and many more voice their wishes at Chapter meetings requesting help with irrigation; AND
- 20. Studies show that native food are more or the most healthy ones than the once made with preservatives; AND
- 21. Our Chapter doesn't only believe in, but participates in cost-sharing and partnership on Projects, especially during this "Economic Crisis Era, inflations, and Cost-of-Living Increases; AND
- 22. The recent pandemic experience has taught us of food scarcity, travel restrictions, limits of food and other necessities, high cost of food, reliance on our only local food store-Bashas and thanks to the Navajo/Hopi Food Assistance Programs; AND
- 23. The Chapter recently received heavy equipment: Grader and backhoe/front end loader to use as cost share; AND
- 24. We need your expertise to evaluate, improve intake inlet from the wash and to reservoir, including the reservoir inlet (Russian Olive/Tamarack takeover).

#### NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Round Rock Chapter Government respectfully requesting the Department of Water Resources Technical, Construction, and Operations Branch to evaluate the Round Rock Irrigation System for rehabilitation, cost estimate and plan of action.



RESPECTFULLY REQUESTING NAVAJO NATION DIVISION OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND NAVAJO NATION AGRICULTURE TO SINCERELY CONSIDER AND FUND \$1,500,000.00 TO REVITALIZE THE 42 FARM PLOTS WITH APPROXIMATE 565.48 ACRE, USING THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN (ARPA), SIHASIN, AND/OR THE AGRICULTURE INFRASTRUCTURE FUND PROJECT PLAN FOR THE CROP YEAR 2021 (PASTURE LAND FORAGE)

#### WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act (26 N.N.C.), Chapter 1, Subchapter 1, Section 3 (A) the Round Rock Chapter Government, is a certified Chapter Organization, which elects a Delegate to the Navajo Nation Council. The Chapter is also listed as being certified at Part 1, Section 10, of 11 N.N.C., the "Navajo Nation Election Code; AND
- 2. Pursuant to the same "Act", Chapter 1, Subchapter 1, Section 1 (B-1), the Navajo Nation Council; delegates to our Chapter, governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Law, including custom and tradition; AND

- 6. Round Rock Chapter Farmers miss farming and having local produced food; AND
- 7. The Community members are looking forward to re-instill the traditional teachings of farming to their children and grandchildren; AND

- 8. There are 42 Farm Owners with acreages anywhere from 10 to 50 acres; AND
- 9. The total farm land acreage registered/titled with the Bureau of Land Administration is 545.48: AND
- 10. The Division department personnel needs to assess the farm plot and provide feasibility studies of plots, collaboration for plan of action, and any recommendations for implementation; AND
- 11. Local grown produce is beneficial not only for consumption but for income by farmers; AND
- 12. The Chuska Mountain water is usually diverted into the lake, however, this has been less water each year; AND
- 13. Drilling for water wells for farming would be most beneficial and irrigating through installation of pipes will save water from evaporating and seeping into the irrigation ditch; AND
- 14. The Chapter Government is concerned about the environmental, living and safety standards of the People; AND
- 15. The corn pollen needs to be made by the Dine' People to help heal and place our Dine' People in balance with the natural livings and on the corn pollen path; AND
- 16. The Chapter members and the young need to learn to be self-sufficient by farming food and hay; AND
- 17. It teaches the young on work ethics, healthy eating, and cultural teachings; AND
- 18. The Division and Agriculture needs to educate and local and coach them on updated farming techniques, ideal seeds, updated farm equipment, as they attend various trainings; AND
- 19. This project has been planned in the local Chapter's strategic plan for many years and must be made a reality using the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) fund; AND
- 20. We are strongly requesting to improve economic development to bring essential services to our Dine' relatives and our Dine' people will be the primary beneficiaries; AND
- 21. It is this type of rescue measures to heal, prevent, improve the lives of Dine' People, which the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) is awarded to resolve.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Round Rock Chapter Government hereby approves and requests Navajo Nation Division of Natural Resources and Navajo Nation Agriculture to sincerely consider and fund \$1,500,000.00, to revitalize the 42 Farm Plots with approximately 565.48 acre using the American Rescue Plan (ARPA), Sihasin, and/or the Agriculture Infrastructure fund project plan for the Crop Year 2021 (Pasture Land Forage).
