Resolution of the Many Farms Chapter MF-18-12-2023

APPROVING AND REQUESTING AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA)
FUNDING FOR N-8084: SAFETY, DRAINAGE & CONNECTIVITY ROAD
IMPROVEMENT PROJECT FOR ARPA ALLOCATION AND APPROVAL BY THE
NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL FOR THE MANY FARMS CHAPTER AND NAVAJO
DIVISION OF TRANSPORTATION AS AN ARPA FUNDED ROAD PROJECT

#### WHEREAS:

- Pursuant to CMY-23-79, the Many Farms Chapter is a certified chapter of the Navajo Nation vested with the authority and responsibility to provide and act on all matters affecting the community; and
- Pursuant to CAP-34-98, the Navajo Nation Council adopted the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act (LGA) that allows Many Farms Chapter to make decisions over local matters; and
- Many Farms Chapter has prioritized its community projects and identified the need for road improvement projects such as school bus routes, drainage crossings, access roads, road maintenance, grading, graveling, mitigation, drainage studies, and construction services; and
- 4. Many Farms Chapter is dedicated to the safety and well-being of community members and the objective to ensure a safe, reliable and efficient unified system or transportation services responsive to the needs of the children and their families; and
- The Many Farms Chapter N-8084: Safety, Drainage and Connectivity road improvement project will address safety issues that occur in wet or icy road conditions from flooding. This project will provide access to employment, schools, expand community services and provide logistical support in emergencies; and
- 6. This N-8084 project will improve quality of life and transportation equity for local residents. This project directly addresses deficiencies connected to the high outbreak of COVID-19 on the Navajo Nation provides access to utilities and government services facilitating sustainable economic and social growth and can drastically increase the quality of healthcare received; and
- 7. Most rural communities on the Navajo Nation lack access to governmental services and COVID-19 impeded these operations. This road improvement project will contribute and strengthen the local direct mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery of local governmental services and emergency situations to address the needs for the community; and
- 8. This project will assist in promoting public health and provide an economic stimulus allowing for a directly benefit to the Navajo people from this project. By concentrating in areas with limited economic opportunities and inadequate or poor housing quality, the access to resources such as roads help facilitate improved health outcomes; and



- 9. This project will improve services connecting residents with healthcare resources, public assistance and build healthier environments to support healthy living environments and communities encouraging better mental and physical wellness. The exacerbation of health disparities during the pandemic and pre-existing social vulnerabilities caused the public health impact of the pandemic; and
- 10. The Navajo Division of Transportation (NDOT) provides professional and technical services to the Navajo Nation communities to address transportation needs for road maintenance, road improvement activities, and proposed transportation infrastructure; and
- 11. Navajo Division of Transportation provides a safe, efficient transportation system that supports economic opportunities and livable communities throughout the Navajo Nation while embracing safety at work, with values and principles of teamwork through integrity, respect and quality assurance; and
- 12. Pursuant to Resolution CJN-29-22, the Navajo Nation Council approved the allocation of \$1,070,298,867.00 of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Funds and approved the Fiscal Recovery Fund Expenditure Plans for: Chapter and Regional Projects; and
- 13. Many Farms Chapter continues to approach the American Rescue Plan funds in a comprehensive manner to take advantage of this once in a lifetime opportunity to strengthen individuals, families and community-based services which are essential to addressing deficiencies identified during the COVID pandemic and our recovery; and
- 14. As the Navajo Nation and its communities continue addressing allocation of ARPA funds to projects across the Navajo Nation, Many Farms Chapter has identified projects and are submitting them for ARPA eligibility and ARPA funding by the Navajo Nation Council; and
- 15. The Navajo Nation Capital Project Management Department (CPMD) has been instrumental in the processing of these ARPA Expenditure plans and move from concept to the completion phase for the benefit of the our communities; and
- 16. Many Farms Chapter plans to coordinate with the Navajo Nation CPMD for the duration of this ARPA project along with Navajo Division of Transportation (NDOT) and any other applicable departments, programs and offices; and
- 17. Many Farms Chapter determines its in the best interests of the Navajo Nation and the local community to support and encourage N-8084 project: Safety, Drainage and Connectivity road improvement project in order to secure the continued benefits to the Navajo people and our community; and
