### APPROVING AND REQUESTING ADDITIONAL FUNDING FROM THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) FOR PROJECTS AND REQUESTING THE 25<sup>TH</sup> NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL TO SUPPORT AND APPROVE ADDITIONAL FUNDING IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,500,000.00 FOR MANY FARMS CHAPTER ARPA PROJECTS

#### WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to CMY-23-79, the Many Farms Chapter is a certified chapter of the Navajo Nation vested with the authority and responsibility to provide and act on all matters affecting the community; and
2. Pursuant to CAP-34-98, the Navajo Nation Council adopted the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act (LGA) that allows Many Farms Chapter to make decisions over local matters; and
3. Pursuant to Resolution CJN-29-22, the Navajo Nation Council approved the allocation of \$1,070,298,867.00 of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Funds and approved the Fiscal Recovery Fund Expenditure Plans for: chapter and regional projects; and
4. The Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund office anticipates that some chapters and organizations will not be able to encumber and expend allocated funds before the deadlines established by the Federal Government; and
5. Many Farms Chapter would like to take a proactive approach and be prepared with shovel-ready projects to take advantage of this once in a lifetime opportunity; and
6. Many Farms Chapter will submit the additional proposed projects to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund office, Division of Community Development and the Navajo Nation Department of Justice to determine project eligibility; and
7. The Navajo Nation Capital Project Management Department (CPMD) has been instrumental in the processing of these ARPA Expenditure plans and move from concept to the completion phase for the benefit of the Many Farms community; and
8. Many Farms Chapter plans to coordinate with the Navajo Nation CPMD for the duration of these ARPA projects.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:**

1. The Many Farms Chapter approves and request additional funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) for projects and requesting the 25<sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council to support and approve additional funding for Many Farms Chapter ARPA project:
