APPROVING APPENDIX-A, BUDGET FORM 1, AND SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS FOR PROPOSED REGIONAL PROJECT EXPENDITURE PLAN FOR \$880,234.00 FOR A NEW WATER PURIFICATION FACLITY AS AN ELIGIBLE PROJECT OF THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND TO MITIGATE COVID-19

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to Navajo Tribal Council Resolution No. CMY-23-79, the Aneth Chapter is duly certified and recognized as an official local unit of the Navajo Nation Government with all duties, responsibilities, and authorities conferred according to 26 N.N.C. § 1 *et seq.* and has the power and authority to enact plans and development goals that are in the best interest of the community and to recommend, support, and approve community related projects.
- 2. The 24th Navajo Nation Council approved resolution CJN-29-22 which adopted the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Chapter and Regional Projects Assistance Expenditure Plan which approved total funding in the amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148.00) to be allocated equally among the twenty-four (24) delegate regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340.00) per Delegate Region and each Navajo Nation Council Delegate is responsible for compiling and selecting projects for their Delegate Region Projects Plan.
- 3. The Aneth Chapter is within legislative district 9 which consists of five (5) chapter represented by Honorable Council Delegate Curtis Yanito. Eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340.00) divided equally among the five (5) chapters amounts to one million seven hundred sixty-four hundred sixty-eight thousand dollars (\$1,760,468.00) per chapter for Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plans.
- 4. In accordance with Section Three of Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJN-29-22 the Aneth Chapter is requesting eight hundred eighty thousand two hundred thirty-four dollars (\$880,234.00) of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Funds for a new Water Purification Facility.
- 5. If, and when, the project is selected, the Delegate Yanito will add the Project as part of the Delegate Region Plan and will thereafter sponsor legislation to be approved by the Navajo Nation Council.

- 6. The New Water Purification Facility Project is being submitted for consideration to be selected as part of the Delegate Region Plan for the purpose of addressing the conditions that contributed to poor public health and economic outcomes during the pandemic. By concentrating in areas with limited economic opportunities and inadequate or poor quality of living. The access to resources and facilitates improved health outcomes including services connecting residents with healthcare resources, public assistance and build healthier environments such access to services such as a water purification facility to support healthy living environments and communities conducive to mental and physical wellness. The exacerbation of health disparities during the pandemic and the role of pre-existing social vulnerabilities are responsive to the public health impact of the pandemic.
- 7. It is in the best interest of the Aneth Chapter and surrounding communities to support and fund this critical development project.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. The Aneth Chapter hereby approves Appendix-A, Budget Form 1, and supporting documents for proposed regional project expenditure plan for \$880,234.00 for a new Water Purification Facility as an eligible project of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund to mitigate COVID-19.
- 2. The Aneth Chapter affirms that chapter will only use awarded funds in compliance with the ARPA, the ARPA Regulations, and all other applicable Navajo Nation and federal laws and regulations.

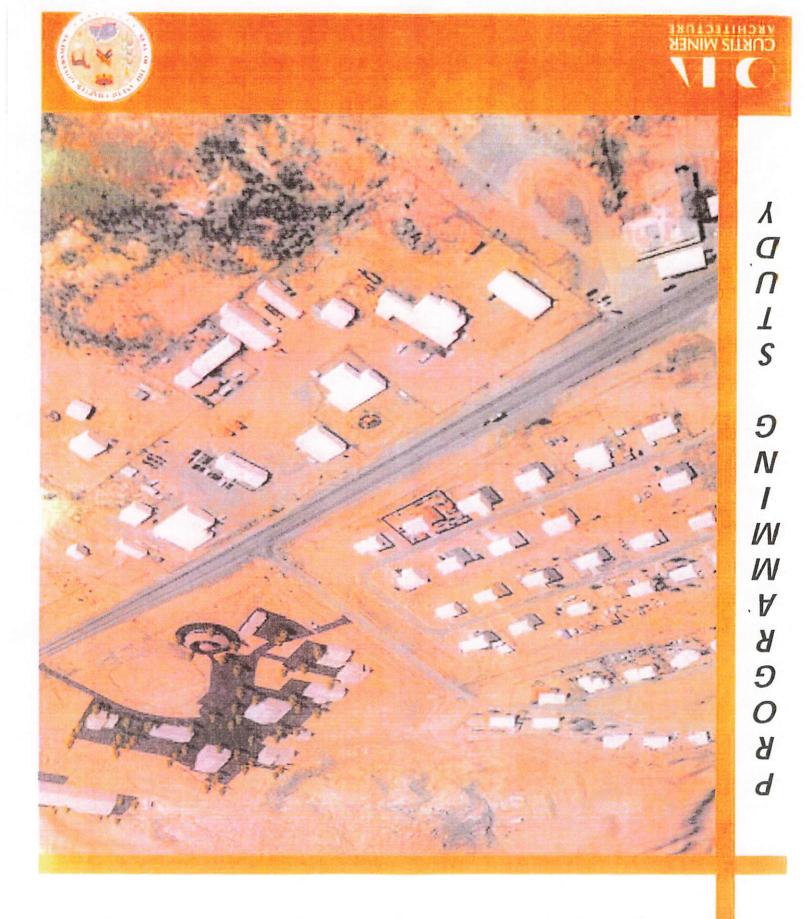

Executive Summary

Introduction

This program and master plan documents the current and potential future state of the Utah Aneth Chapter and the Aneth City. The intent of this study is to provide a guide and vision for understanding the community and the buildings and spaces necessary to help facilitate their current needs and future needs. This document is intended to provide a basis of design for future projects, necessary public buildings and master planning for a 24-acre parcel of land in Aneth City.

The master plan concept provided summarizes a information gathering process that included a number of discussions with the Aneth Chapter officials as well as other Navajo Nation tribal authorities and other interested entities. The master plan document will present and illustrate the proposed design concepts for the Aneth Chapter as observed by the consultant team (see acknowledgements).

Conclusions

Aneth City has been in need of amenities and infrastructure to support community cohesion and unity as well as current and future needs. Over time the community of Aneth has experienced population growth as well as decline. This population fluctuation can be attributed to many factors; however, the leaders of the Aneth community are highly committed to the success of the local residents and families and are intent on providing a place where community growth and harmony and can be nurtured. The proposed master plan presented for the City of Aneth is intended to provide a center place in Aneth to obtain the services and needs of the local citizens and foster a greater sense of community and a vision for the residents.





Future State

a. Overview

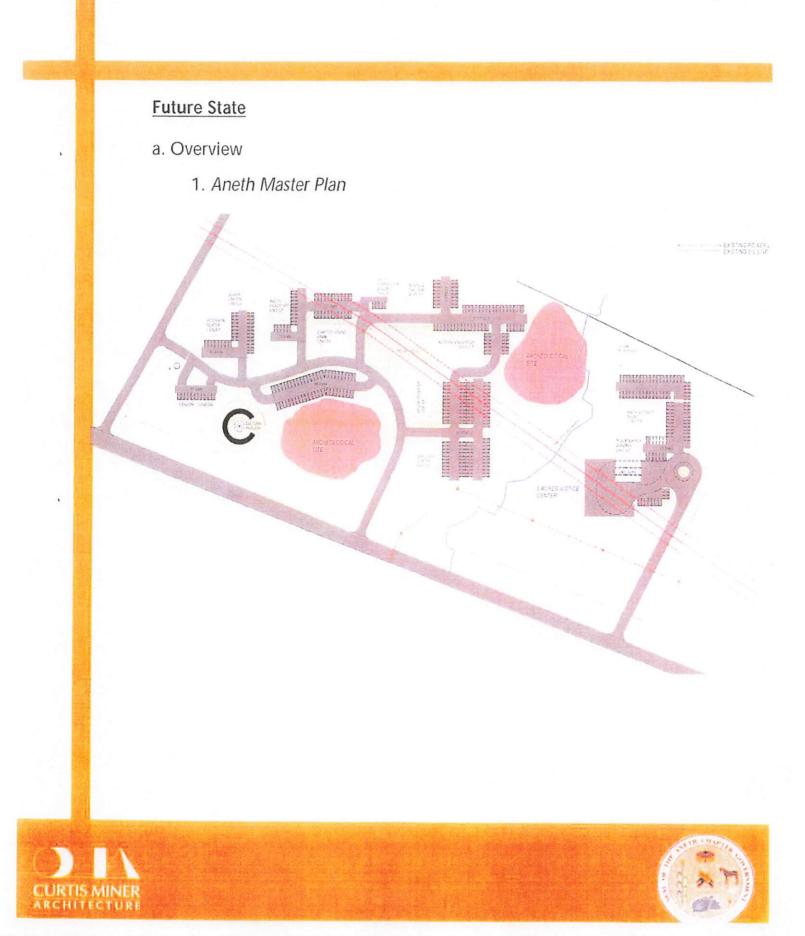
The Aneth community has been in need of services and amenities for their residents, both old and young, for many years. The master plan area chosen is 24 acre parcel adjacent to the North side of state highway 162 and East of the current Aneth Chapter house. The intent of this master plan is to provide many of these services that will support the needs of the residents and at the same time create a sense of place and belonging by bringing a focal point to the community. The proposed master plan is intended to be a community hub by fostering the Navajo culture through integration of a cultural pavilion, a new Aneth Chapter house, a recreation building, a public safety building, various senior support centers, wellness clinics, vendor opportunities, and a school. The Aneth Chapter is focused on providing this infrastructure and various amenities and services to the community and creating a connected town center area that can facilitate the needs of the residents for many years to come.

The proposed buildings included in this master plan include:

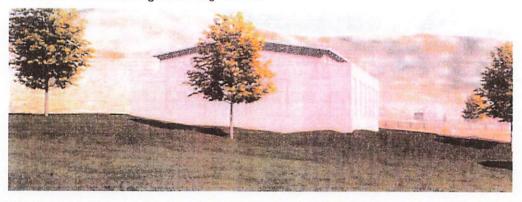
1. Aneth Chapter house

The master plan proposal includes a new Aneth Chapter house that will provide a gathering place to conduct administrative procedures and facilitate Chapter coordination and cohesion. This is designed to be near the center of the development and the cultural pavilion.



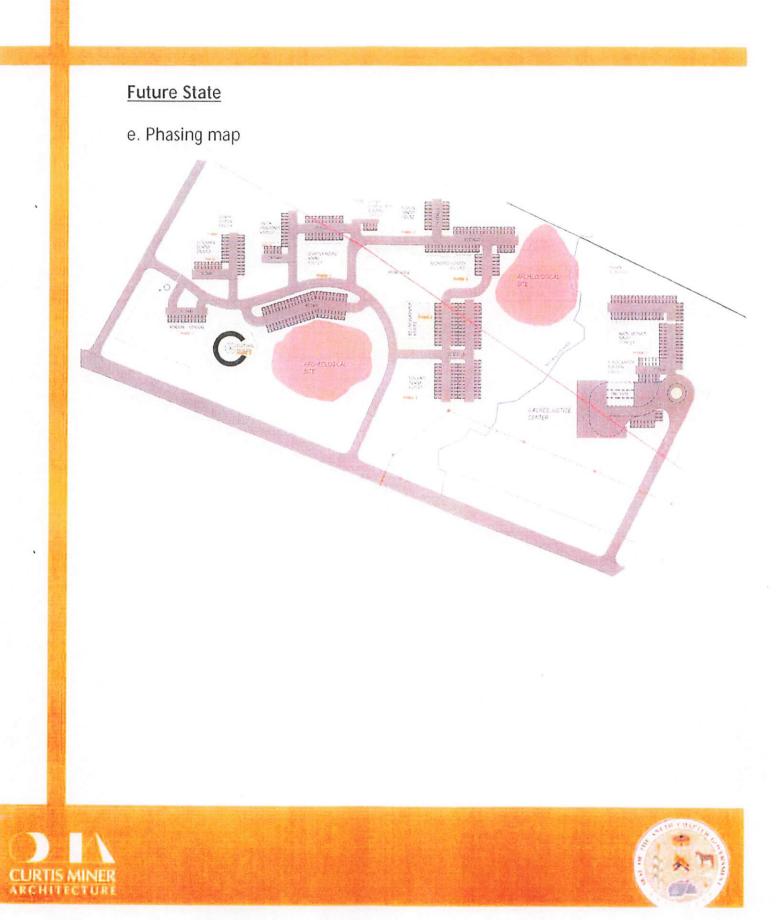
2. Recreation Center

The proposed Recreation Center will be a great amenity for the entire community and will provide a source of recreation and relaxation as well as a gathering place for the youth. The recreation center is surrounded with lawns and landscaped to allow additional outdoor uses and gathering areas.









Concept Development

Concept Development

a. Assumptions

This Aneth master plan is a design exercise to better understand how the community of Aneth will need to be serviced in the future. Although, many efforts have been made to understand the nuances of needs that exist in the community and to provide potential answers for those needs, this document is not comprehensive in nature and does not account for all situations or potential buildings and services that the community of Aneth may require. It is assumed that this document will provide a baseline on which to begin moving toward full design services which may or may not include; civil, landscaping, architectural, structural, mechanical, plumbing, and electrical services, as well as other specialty design and engineering as the project may require.

The building massing and forms show in this proposed master plan are intended as general massing and do not necessarily reflect the size, shape, or orientation of the buildings final position and form. They are intended to provide context and for conceptual purposes only.





Cost Analysis and Phasing

Cost Analysis and Phasing

Initial cost analysis is outside of the scope of work for this project and it to be based upon DFCM's general cost estimate of \$20 to \$30 million for this project. Construction costs would be subject to current market value and material costs. Whereas this project is divided up into phases of construction, the hard and soft costs for the project would need to be calculated as refinement of the project continued and each new phase was undertaken.





11. Vendor

The proposed Vendor buildings will provide a business and employment opportunities to the residents of the community. These are situated near the main road to provide access to travelers and community members alike.

12. Water Purification Building

The proposed Water Purification building will provide a vital resource to the community through monitoring and treating the water system needed for the master plan.

13. Hogan

The proposed Hogan is a structure dedicated to assisting those undergoing recovery and in the judicial system.

The proposed Aneth master plan as it comes to fruition will provide the residents of Aneth as well as visitors to the area many services and amenities to enrich their lives through better public safety access, better health care provisions, better recreational opportunities, and a cultural experience that generate a sense of belonging and pride for current and future generations.
