RESOLUTION OF INDIAN WELLS CHAPTER

REQUESTING, ACCEPTING, AND APPROVING CJN-29-22, AMERICAN RESCUE
PLAN ACT (ARPA) FUNDING IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,760,468.00 FOR INDIAN
WELLS CHAPTER TO BE UTILIZE FOR HOME RENOVATIONS,
MODERNIZATIONS, AND WEATHERIZATIONS

RESOLUTION # IWC-22-61

WHEREAS:

- The Indian Wells Chapter is a recognized Chapter of the Navajo Nation and recognized as a local governmental entity vested with certain authority and responsibilities to consider and act on matters of local concern that are in the best interest of health, safety and welfare of the Chapter membership and residents; and
- Pursuant to 26 NNC, Navajo Nation Local Governance Act (LGA), the Navajo Nation Council delegates Chapters governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Nation Laws including customs and traditions to make decisions over local matter and to govern with responsibility and accountability to the local citizens; and
- Indian Wells Chapter appreciates the 24TH Navajo Nation Council, Office of President, and Vice President in passing and signing Legislation CJN-29-22: American Rescue Plan Act; and
- Indian Wells community members have requested expenditure for housing renovations, modernizations, weatherization of multi-generational, elderly, disabled, young families and economic disadvantage community member homes; and
- Indian Wells Chapter will utilize these funds to hire local skilled carpenters, Public Employment Program (PEP) laborers, professional services, purchase materials and equipment for this renovation projects; and
- Indian Wells Chapter recognizes the need for these home renovations to combat Covid 19
 and improve substandard living conditions for the multi-generational, elderly, disabled,
 young families and economic disadvantage homes; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

Indian Wells Chapter requests, accepts and approves Legislation CJN-29-22, American Rescue Plan Act funding in the amount of \$1,760,468.00 for 2.18 Housing Support; Other Housing assistance and 3.3 Public Sector Workforce; Other in providing Home Renovations for Indian Wells community members to be utilized for home renovations, modernizations, and weatherization.
