#### RESOLUTION OF THE CHINLE CHAPTER NAVAJO NATION CHIN-OCT-22-071

APPROVING THE SELECTION OF THE WELLNESS CENTER PROJECT FOR THE INCLUSION ON THE CHINLE CHAPTER DELEGATE REGION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$750,000.00.

#### WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to Navajo Nation Code, Section 4001 (d) and 4028 (2), (b) the Chinle Chapter is established and certified as a local government entity of the Navajo Nation vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the chapter and submit appropriate recommendations to the Navajo Nation government of other local agencies by resolutions; and
- 2. To support the efforts of the Navajo Nation to mitigate the effects of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Fiscal Recovery Funds were allocated to develop the basic infrastructure to improve lives of people who have lived without water, electricity and "basic services to support their daily activities, health, and welfare"; and
- 3. The Navajo Nation Council approved CJN-29-22, in response to the COVID-19 Pandemic in the best interest of the people: "An Action Relating to the Navajo Nation Relating to the Navajo Nation Council; Allocating \$1,070,298,867 of Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Funds; Approving the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Expenditure Plans for: Chapter Assistance; Public Safety Emergency Communications, E911, and Rural Addressing Projects; Cyber Security; Public Health Projects, Economic Development Projects; Hardship Assistance; Water and Wastewater Projects; Broadband Projects; Home Electricity Connection and Electricity Capacity Projects; Housing Projects and Manufactured Housing Facilities, Bathroom Addition Projects, Construction Contingency Funding; and Reduced Administrative Funding"; and
- Administrative Funding"; and
  4. The Chinle Chapter Government has attended several meetings with Navajo Nation Division of Community Development, Navajo Tribal Utility Authority, and the Fiscal Recovery Fund Office; and
- 5. The eligible attached Exhibit: Chinle Chapter Wellness Center was selected as a Project to be included on the Navajo Nation Council Delegate Eugene Tso Chapter Region in the amount of \$750,000.00 for the Chinle Chapter; and
- 6. The total amount for Chinle Chapter Delegate Region is \$8,802,340.00.

#### NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Chinle Chapter Government hereby approves the selection of Chinle Chapter Wellness Center as a selected Project to be included on the Navajo Nation Council Delegate Eugene Tso Chapter Region in the amount of \$750,000.00.

We hereby certify that the foregoing chapter resolution was duly considered by the Chinle Chapter at a duly called meeting at which time a quorum was present. Delivery of Steel Materials - In order to lock in the steel price as shown on the proposal, the steel package must be ordered immediately after contract signing. This



  - The Chinle Chapter service area provides wellness centers in two noted locations: Chinle Chapter and Chinle Wellness Center. The two current facilities are closed and are unable to provide services to the community members, due to COVID-19 closures and restrictions. The COVID-19 pandemic has limited our resources to provide community wellness due to building capacity, social distancing, and sanitization. Currently, the Chinle Chapter wellness center remains closed due to restrictions. The Chinle Wellness Center is currently being utilized for COVID-19 services. The safety and welfare of those community members that our facilities serve, is currently not available. Chinle Chapter proposes to plan, design, and construct a new facility that would be designated to meet new current health order standards and requirements, while at the same time serving the community wellness programs needs.
- 12. Describe in detail the specific solution(s) to the health (safety and welfare concerns articulated above and provide relevant, reliable data in support.
  - At Chinle Chapter, the existing wellness center is located on the second floor of the Chapter house and does not meet accessibility requirements. During normal operations (Pre-COVID-19), Chinle Chapter averaged roughly 40 participants per day throughout the 2019 year data, which totals roughly 10,400 participants that visit the wellness center annually. The Chinle Chapter wellness center provide fitness equipment that range from cardio, weights, bike rides, and training sessions. The Chinle Chapter community wellness center remains close as of March 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
  - The Chinle Wellness Center is located in Chinle, Az and serves not only the Chinle community, but other surrounding communities. The existing building is a portable building estimated 3,255 square feet. The building has been remodeled to meet their on going needs, but is still in need of additional space. The wellness center accommodates patient referrals, nutritional health, behavioral health, and overall physical butters. During normal operations (Pre-COVID-19), the Chinle Wellness Center had an average of over 3,000 user visits per month, which consists of Chinle Service Unit patients referred from the hospital, employees, and community members that utilized the facility (See Attachments from 2019 and 2020). As you can see, the Wellness Center had been functioning at over capacity for years. In consideration of the new COVID-19 restrictions for physical distancing and ventilation, the center will not be able to accommodate community members due to the size of the facility. Moreover, the Wellness Center facility has been closed since March 2020 due to the building being utilized for COVID-19 operations. Currently, the facility remains closed due to drive-thru respiratory clinic utilizing the facility and due to Navajo Nation restricted guidelines. The Wellness Center services are presently limited and delivered via telephone, virtually, and outdoors.
  - The Chinle Special Diabetes Program has also highlighted the need of wellness centers and programs for our community members. The Special Diabetes Program serves 30,760 members within target groups on the Navajo Nation (See Attachments from NSDP 2019). They serve 16 surrounding Chapters. The program works in conjunction with Chinle IHS and refers patients to






