RESPECTFULLY REQUESTING THE NAVAJO NATION DIVISION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT SINCERELY CONSIDER ESTABLISHING THE RINCON MARQUISE COMMUNITY, LISTED IN THE INFRASTRUCTURE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN (ICIP), AND FUND \$101,000.00

WHEREAS

- Pursuant to 26 N.N.C. Section 3 (A) Whitehorse Lake Chapter is a duly recognized certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government as listed at 11 N.N.C. part 1, section 10; AND
- Pursuant to 26 N.N.C. section 1 (B) Whitehorse Lake Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate corrections when necessary and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate actions; AND
- Whitehorse Lake Chapter is a duly certified Local Government entity of the Navajo
 Nation with the responsibility to promote and protect the interest and welfare of its
 community people pursuant to Title 11, section 4001 (a) of the Navajo Tribal Code; AND
- Section 1 (B-2, authorized our chapter, to improve community decision-making: to allow
 us to excel and flourish; enable our Navajo Leaders to lead towards a prosperous future,
 and improve the strength and sovereignty of the Navajo Nation. Our chapter is
 compelled to govern with responsibility and accountability to us, and local citizens AND
- 4. Pursuant to the Federal "Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act (P.L.; 93-638), as amended our chapter Government, is entitled, and supposed to initiate plans and make recommendations, requests, and thus, determine the promotion, protection, and preservation of the welfare of our community People as well as the Navajo nation; AND
- 5. The Whitehorse Lake Chapter has combated this matter for many years AND,

- Currently the community of Rincon Marquise community has a cemetery, there is overcrowding and community members have been requesting for expansion of the cemetery.
- 7. The expansion and reconstruction of the Cemetery will relieve scattered development of family plots and family division regarding such family plots, AND
- 8. With the uncertainty of where or how COVID-19 may/may not progress having a cemetery readily available will provide for loved ones and allow families/relatives to grieve and pay respect, AND

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT;

1. The Whitehorse Lake Chapter hereby approves the Navajo Nation Division of Community Development sincerely consider establishing the Rincon Marquise Community Cemetery, listed in the Unfractured Capital Improvement Plans (ICIP) NS TO FIND \$101,000.00
