RESOLUTION OF COUNSELOR CHAPTER APPROVING AND REQUESTING NAVAJO NATION OFFICE OF PRESIDENT AND VICE-PRESIDENT, NAABIK'IYATI' COMMITTEE, NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL AND BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE TO SUPPORT AND APPROVE THE COUNSELOR CHAPTER EXPENDITURE PLAN FOR POWERLINE PROJECT (CEDAR HILL) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$304,143.54 FROM THE ARPA FUNDS.

WHEREAS:

Per Resolution CAP-34-98, the Navajo Nation Council adopted the Local Governance Act and through the adoption of this Act delegated to the Navajo Nation Chapters governmental authority with respect to all local issues/ matters consistent with Navajo Nation Laws, customs and traditions; and

Counselor Chapter delegated to act within its authority will improve community decisions making, allowing communities to excel and flourish, enabling Navajo Nation leaders to lead towards a prosperous future of its community: and improve the strength and sovereignty of the Navajo Nation; and

3. Counselor Chapter knows that the Fiscal Recovery Funds are specifically intend to respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency and its negative economic impacts including assistance to households and respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID-10 public health emergency by providing hazard and premium pay to eligible workers; and

Counselor Chapter believes it is in the best interest of the community and its chapter to support and approve the Counselor Chapter Expenditure Plan for the benefit of its community especially during the on-going COVID-19 pandemic.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

Counselor Chapter hereby approves and request the Navajo Nation President and Vice President, the ' Naabik'iyati' Committee, Navajo Nation Council and the Budget & Finance Committee to support and approve the Counselor Chapter Cedar Hill Powerline Extension Expenditure Plan in the amount of \$304,143.54 from ARPA Funds.
