1. What are the criteria to be approved for a new home? How will recipients be selected?

All homes are predetermined to be eligible prior to submission by approved Resolution by the Black Mesa Chapter. Priority is primarily based on the more aggressive applicants, those that obtain their Homesite Lease and have submitted their Homesite Lease to the Chapter for final approval. All applicants for Homesite Lease are assured assistance by the Black Mesa Chapter with Housing Discretionary Fund to get their Homesite Lease cleared for archeological clearance and land survey. Black Mesa Chapter is working with certain Navajo archeologists to obtain a group rate to lower the cost of clearing each site.

To become eligible, recipients are to complete the process of the home site Lease application. Upon receiving an approved home site lease from the Navajo Nation, he/she will be eligible for ARPA housing assistance and add on to the list of Approved Housing Assistance Project.

The list of people for the housing assistance project is based on the housing needs.

#### Criteria for Eligibility:

- A. Complete and Approved Home Site Lease
- B. Do not own a house or existing house that does not meet applicable building code standards
- C. Limited access to running water for handwashing and health care

NOTE: Navajo President Nygren has strongly advocate for 1000 House Initiative for the Navajo people. Black Mesa Chapter believes the community people of Black Mesa Region will benefit in acquiring a home.

 Explain whether home construction would qualify for any federal funded housing programs, ei:, National Housing Trust Fund, Indian Housing Block Grant Program, Indian Community Block Grant Program or BIA Housing Improvement Program. (Eligibility for one of these programs is a favorable factor in determining whether housing project is eligible as a use of Nation's Fiscal Recovery Fund).

There are some obstacles to applying for Federal Housing Programs.

- A. National Housing Trust Fund, Indian Community Block Grant Program and BIA Housing Improvement Program are more at the Nation-wide housing programs where an applicant will apply elsewhere than Navajo Housing Authority. An applicant will need to search for locations to apply for these programs which will, eventually, go through the prolonged process of getting approval and, also, it is based on availability of funds.
- B. Indian Housing Block Grant Program Funds are allocated to Navajo Housing Authority. According to NHA Director, these funds are used for homeownership housing and scattered housing programs. Each assistance program is based on income and the ability to make monthly payments (if you have a steady job). It also requires building a house within 100 ft. of existing powerline and waterline infrastructure (reasonable access to utilities).

Many Navajo people do not live within 100 ft. of utilities infrastructure, therefore no access to do research for federal housing grants/programs. 80% of the local family are in low-income bracket, 70% of local family are single family and 70% education level is high school graduate or less.

3. How many individuals or families will be assisted with project funding? What size houses will be built?

The first 10 completed approved home site lease will be assisted with the project funding. Currently, there are 24 recipients, as follow:

12 recipients - one person in household (adults and elders)
7 recipients - two people in household (Adults, elders, and children)
1 recipient - three people in household (adult and children)
4 recipients - four people in household (Adults and children)

The Chapter will assist, recommend, and direct the remaining 14 (including others community members) that did not meet the eligibility for ARPA Housing Projects to NHA and BIA housing assistance programs. There is a dire need for an adequate housing infrastructure, including utilities and broadbands.



3. Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJN-29-22, also Includes Funding Distribution of \$211,256,148 among the 24 Regional Chapters at \$8,802,340 which calculates into @1,760,468 per each of the five (5) Dzilyijiin Regional Chapter; And

4. There are so many unmet needs within Black Mesa Chapter Community, after careful review of the total, it is determined essential that housing constructed be considered and the most needing homes are: Juanita Small, Paulin Begay, Howard Honic, Peter Nez, Annie B. Ten, Hasbah Gilmore, Elaine Yellowhorse, Polly Deal, Berjelokie Yazzie, Larry Hadley, Samantha T. Ranger, Sanya Rose, Adrienne Etsitty, Brandon Watchman, Albert Lee, Arlene W. Rockbridge, Louise Nez, Dickerson Smith Jr., Lucy Lee, Francis Honie, Patrick W. Begay, Tasha Yellowhair, Larry Biltah, Charmayne Nez and Tanya Rose.

5. This priority is a must to be submitted by The Honorable Jimmy Yellowhair, Council Delegate, ASAP. (These potential Projects must be Forwarded to NAVAJO NATION D.O.J. within reason time line for review).

6. The Black Mesa Chapter affirms that the chapter will only use awarded funds in the compliance with the ARPA Regulations, and other applicable Navajo Nation and Federal Laws and Regulations.

## NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVE, THAT:

1. REQUESTING THE NAVAJO NATION, INCLUDING HONORABLE JIMMY YELLOWHAIR, COUNCIL DELEGATE OF THE NAVAJO COUNCIL TO ACCEPT THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE BLACKMESA CHAPTER GOVERNMENT AS SUBMITTED HEREIN.
