This project consists of 54-bathroom additions and/or renovations that will provide plumbing to homes that do not have running water for bathrooms & sanitation purposes. Homes will be assessed on a case-by-case basis & costs associated for addition or renovation materials & labor will be determined at that time. These 54-bathroom additions/ renovations will coincide with the progress & completion of the Sleepy Mountain Waterline Extension Project. The funding will also help pay for Workers that will complete these projects. Bathroom Additions & Renovations will provide remedies for sanitation deficiencies which will directly address negative impacts of the COVID-19 Pandemic & other situations

RESOLUTION OF HARD ROCK CHAPTER: HRC 2023/04-01 APPROVING THE SELECTION OF THE HARDROCK CHAPTER BATHROOM ADDITIONS AND RENOVATIONS PROJECT FOR INCLUSION ON THE HARDROCK CHAPTER DELEGATE REGION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,400,458.

WHEREAS

- 1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3 (A) the Hard Rock Chapter is a duly recognized certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, as listed at 11 N.N.C., part 1, section 10, and
- 2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1 (B) Hard Rock Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate correction when necessary and make recommendation to the Navajo Nation and other local agencies for appropriate actions, and
- 3. To support the efforts of the Navajo Nation to mitigate the effects of the COVID-19 Pandemic and its negative economic impacts, the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Fiscal Recovery Funds were allocated to help improve the lives of our community members by helping the Hardrock Chapter build bathroom additions or renovate bathrooms for those residents that will obtain this basic utility service of running water/ plumbing by way of the Sleepy Mountain Waterline Extension Project.
- 4. The Hardrock Chapter Administration, Community Members and Chapter Officials recommend the approval of the Hardrock Chapter Bathroom Addition/ Renovations to be included in the Hardrock Chapter Delegate Region in the amount of \$1,340,000. The funds will be expended as illustrated in Exhibit A (attached).
- 5. Hardrock Chapter affirms that the Chapter will only use the awarded Funds in compliance with the ARPA, the ARPA Regulations, and all other applicable Navajo Nation and Federal laws and regulations.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Hardrock Chapter hereby approves and implement the of the Hardrock Chapter Bathroom Addition/ Renovations to be included in the Hardrock Chapter Delegate Region in the amount of \$1,400,458. The funds will be expended as illustrated in Exhibit A (attached).

It's nice to meet you Christina and begin working together to continue the work on the Sleepy Mtn. Waterline Project. Currently the project is in the last phases of design completion, almost ready for final review before handing off for approval from NECA. CHAPTER 5. Eligibility for IHS SFC Program Services and IHS-Funded Projects

Table 5-1. Basic Eligibility Criteria for Service by the SFC Program*

Eligible Persons

• Any member of a Federally recognized tribe, band, group. or community of American Indians/Alaska Native persons who are within the scope of the IHS program. Eligibility is also extended to certain unaffiliated California Indians.

• Other non-Indian persons, organizations, or enterprises can also be included in approved IHS projects

provided they contribute funds to IHS to cover the prorated cost of the facilities required to serve them.
SFC projects must be primarily for the benefit of Indians. The request for sanitation facilities generally must come from a Federally recognized tribal government.

Eligible homes:

IHS funds sanitation facilities projects to serve homes only. Homes are defined as 24-hour year-round family dwellings.

• Existing homes that do not meet housing support project eligibility criteria may be served with regular project funds.

• New homes (non-HUD funded). like-new homes, and homes of referred patients with medical conditions are eligible for IHS housing support funds.

• Existing homes renovated with HUD Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) funds are eligible

for housing support provided they meet the like-new home eligibility criteria for that project.

• Eligible homes must be in counties that are IHS CHSDAs.

Incligible homes:

· HUD funded new homes are not eligible for IHS funded construction of sunitation facilities.

Eligible sanitation facilities that the IHS SFC Program can provide include water supply, water treatment, water storage, water distribution, sewage collection, sewage treatment, and sewage disposal facilities for homes in communities and for scattered homes. IHS can provide solid waste containers, solid waste collection vehicles, solid waste transfer stations, solid waste landfills, O&M equipment, and O&M training.

Eligible Indian communities that are organized communities that are 50 percent or more Federally
recognized AI/AN people can be provided assistance using IIIS sanitation facilities construction funds.

In non-Indian communities (less than 50 percent Indian population, IHS can provide sanitation facilities

to Indian homes if the homes (new or existing) are not currently served by the community system.

• In non-Indian communities with a total population of less than 10.000 people, IIIS can provide a prorated amount of funds toward the construction of upgrades to existing community water supply and waste disposal facilities.

Eligible services

• Emergency project funds may be used where an actual or imminent public health problem caused by a natural or man-made incident that adversely affects sanitation facilities serving Indian homes.

• Special project funds may be used for activities that usually do not directly provide sanitation facilities to Indian homes and communities. Examples include engineering investigations, service to certain existing non-domestic facilities (limit per facility is \$10,000), O&M projects, special studies, and training projects. Schools typically are not eligible, and new tribal facilities and buildings are not eligible for special project funds.

• O&M technical assistance projects may be funded with special project funds to improve the ability of tribal utility authorities to provide operation and maintenance of sanitation facilities.

• Other non-project engineering services. SFC funds can be used to develop small pre-design projects (e.g., for archeological surveys, etc.) in preparation of a much larger housing support or regular project the next year. Only regular or special funds can be used to develop solid waste management plans. All other technical assistance must be done with program or special project funds.

Area specific eligibility criteria. An Area office may require additional technical, environmental, and economic criteria established by each Area in consultation with the Area Tribal Advisory Committee (TAC)

CRITERIA FOR ASSIGNING SANITATION FACILITIES CONSTRUCTION PROJECT PRIORITIES AND INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION OF PROJECT PROPOSAL

FORM IHS-62

The information requested on the project proposal, Form IHS-62, is needed to record the interest of an Indian tribe or group for a project under the Indian sanitation facilities construction activity. The form is not intended for personal use by individual Indians or Indian families.

Upon receipt of a completed project proposal, a representative of the Public Health Service will contact the tribal or group representative(s) and arrange for the development and preparation of a project summary. Accepted projects will be scheduled for construction when funds become available.

All project summaries will be considered on the basis of the following criteria:

- A. Urgency of health need of Indian population in locations to be served.
- B. Feasibility of project from an engineering and economic standpoint.
- C. Ability and willingness of Indian tribes, communities or groups to assume or share with other public bodies in responsibility for maintenance and operation of sanitary facilities to be provided.
- D. Ability and willingness of Indian tribes, communities or groups to participate in the project by specific contributions, such as labor, materials, equipment, services, or funds.
- E. Relationship of project to broader plans for sanitation improvement developed or approved by Indian tribes, communities or groups.
- F. Enactment or applicability of enforceable sanitary laws, ordinances, or regulations calculated to aid in accomplishing the purposes of the construction and applicable to the area to be served by the facility.

Instructions for Completion of Form IHS-62

Complete four copies of the project proposal. Retain one copy and forward the original and two copies to the Director of the facility designated in Item 16.

Instructions for completing items which are not self-explanatory are as follows:

- Item 12—Enter name and address and telephone number of organization that will be designated to represent your tribe or group in dealing with the Public Health Service, such as, "Tribal Council," "Public Works Committee," "Health Committee," etc. Also include name of the official of the organization to be contacted.
- Item 16—The name and address of the local facility to which the completed proposal will be mailed shall be entered by the PHS representative before the forms are distributed to the person(s) completing the project proposal for the Indian tribe or group.
