The homes will be a single modular home with two bedrooms, kitchen, living room and bathroom area. Homes will either be built or be mobile homes. The square footage is 864 square feet and approximately 24×36 in size.

3. Please describe how the estimated size and cost per home compares to homes in the area?

I do not know the estimated size and cost per home in the area as most homes are based on different income criteria and eligibility determination for housing assistance. Some homes are old and there are a lot of mobile homes that are purchased by homeowners.

4. Please explain whether the home construction projects would qualify for any federal funded housing programs, including, but not limited to the National Housing Trust Fund, Indian Housing Block Grant program, the Indian Community Develop Block Grant program, or the BIA Housing Improvement Program.

I am not familiar with those programs and do not know how this will benefit these families in need. I am sure that majority of these families have applied for assistance for housing with Navajo Housing Authority and other entities to try to secure housing, but to no avail as housing was not available. With that being said, this is the opportune time to get these families in homes especially those that are in dire need and the eligibility criteria being used.

NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS KAIBETO CHAPTER NEW HOUSING APPLICATION CRITERIA

1. Eligibility Determination:

- a. One new housing application per applicant
- b. Applicant must be 18 years old or older
- c. All information on the application is accurate and filled out entirely. If any information is not provided, your application will be considered incomplete and placed in "pending status".
- d. All information on the application will be true and complete, any misrepresentation or false information will be justification for refusal of housing assistance.
- e. All applications must have applicant's required supporting documents attached:
 - Identification Card
 - Certificate of Indian Blood (CIB)
 - Proof of Chapter Voter Registration
 - Approved homesite/residential lease (with Navajo Nation environmental Compliance Forms)
- f. All records shall be considered confidential information pertaining to the applicant(s) request for assistance, and/or assistance provided shall not be made public without the written consent of the applicant.
- g. Applications shall not be taken over the phone or fax and verbal applications shall not be accepted.
- h. A map of residence is required to provide directions to the primary residence/home.
- i. A referral from a governmental agency, official representative or medical physician will justify the applicant's need for housing assistance.

2. Application Homesite Assessments:

- a. Kaibeto Chapter officials/Chapter Administration will conduct applicant homesite assessment to verify all information on the application is accurate, if any information on application is determined false, applicant will be ineligible for housing assistance.
- b. Visual assessment of the existing home will determine if a new home is to be constructed or a possible renovation to a livable standard.
- c. Existing homes will also be considered for demolition and removal if a new home is considered.
- d. A mobile home shall not be worked on if it is unsafe and unsanitary to live in.

3. Application Selection Criteria:

- a. Applicant has a burnout home
- b. Applicant is disabled/severe health concerns
- c. Overcrowded or multi-generational home
- d. Applicant's existing home is dilapidated (unrepairable)
- e. Carefully review applicants' name on the homesite lease, will not assist applicant if applicant is not on the lease.

4. If construction work cannot proceed, Kaibeto Chapter shall indicate on the application to refer the client to programs that offer assistance for such repairs. Potential referral resources:

- a. HIP (Housing Improvement Program)
- b. LIHEAP (Low Income Heat Energy Assistance Program)
- c. NHA (Navajo Housing Assistance)
- d. Rural Development Grants for Elderly
- e. CDBG (Community Development Block Grant)

5. <u>Home Size Determination</u>:

- a. All applicant's receiving new homes will also receive the required infrastructure to facilitate the home to include electricity, solar, natural gas/propane, water/wastewater and cistern/septic system, wood stove.
- b. The new housing will only be 24X36 (864 square footage) with two bedrooms.
- c. Estimated cost per house is \$45,000 to \$50,000. As of now the cost of the housing materials are changing as we wait for the actually construction.



The Resolution of K'ai'Bii'Tó Chapter

SUPPORT AND APPROVE THE REQUEST OF THE DELEGATE REGIONAL EXPENDITURE PLAN TO FUND TO PLAN, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE HOUSING SUPPORT: SERVICE FOR UNHOUSED COMMUNITY MEMBERS, AFFORDABLE HOUSING IN AMOUNT OF \$630,000.00

WHEREAS:

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- The K'ai'Bii'Tó Chapter is certified by N.N.C. pursuant to 2 N.N.C. Section 4001 and 4028 (a) as established Navajo Nation Chapter to serve as Local Governing entity to promote matters affecting its Community and pursuant to N.N.C. Section 4002 and it may enact Local Community Ordinance on issues involving its local Constituency, subject to an approval of appropriate N.N.C. oversight Committees; and
- Pursuant to 26 N.N.C. 1001 (A), the K'ai'Bii'Tó Chapter is vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make the appropriate corrections when necessary and to make recommendations to the Navajo Nation, State, Federal and other local agencies for appropriate actions; and,
- 3. The K'ai'Bii'Tó Chapter strives for the betterment of its people by providing and assisting them with opportunity for improvement in the areas of livelihood, health, safety, education.
- 4. American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 was approved by U.S. Congress on March 05, 2021 and was signed by the U.S. President Joe Biden on March 11, 2021, and;
- 5. The Navajo Nation was awarded \$1.9 Billion for funding for individuals, businesses, and state, local and tribal governments, and;
- 6. The funding provides additional relief to address the continues negative impact of COVID-19, and;
- 7. The K'ai'Bii'Tó Chapter request the funding for the construction of the 15 homes for the families living in multi-generational homes, homeless families and individuals; and
- 8. The K'ai'Bii'Tó Chapter acknowledges that it will provide sanitary infrastructure (water, wastewater, and electricity) to help combat COVID-19; and
- 9. The K'ai'Bii'Tó Chapter has planned and designed the construction of the homes; and
- 10. The K'ai'Bii'Tó Chapter Administration will do assessment and the selection of families to receive the homes.
- 11. The K'ai'Bii'To Chapter will hire Temporary Employee to build the homes in the community

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The K'ai'Bii'To Chapter hereby Support, and Approves the request of the Delegate Regional Expenditure Plan to fund to Plan, Design, and Construction of the Housing for unhoused Community Members, affordable housing e in the amount of \$630,000,00
