The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic has defined the need for access to Internet services for work and distance learning, and when schools switched to distance learning in March 2020, the majority of the families living in this particular area lacked access to services which resulted in severely affecting the connectivity of students and homework bound.

Smith Bagley, Inc., Cellular One

Smith Bagley, Inc., has conducted an initial engineering study of two proposed wireless facility locations, which are identified as Many Farms east and Many Farms north.

Both site locations are approximately 6 - 8 miles north of the Chapter House with access from hwy 191.

Both proposed sites would include the installation of a permanent 120'+ tower and support 4G-LTE wireless services, connected by future fiber optic cable.

With the completion of these two facilities, mobile and fixed 4G wireless services will be extended into the north Many Farms area.

The initial proposed budget for each tower project, pre-sales tax is as follows:
