RELATED TO THE NAVAJO NATION CORONAVIRUS STATE AND LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS PROGRAM. HEREBY RECOMMENDING AND APPROVING FUNDING LOW MOUNTAIN CHAPTER IN THE AMOUNT OF \$ 700,000.00 FROM THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS (NNFRF) AS AUTHORIZED BY THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT TOWARD THE LOW MOUNTAIN CHAPTER CELL TOWER CONSTRUCTION PLANS WITH CELLULARONE.

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to Title 26 N.N.C., § 3 (A) and as listed pursuant to Title 11 N.N.C., Part 1 § 10 the LMC is a duly recognized certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation government and as such may preserve or promote community interests; AND,
- 2. Pursuant to Title 26 N.N.C., § 1 (B) the LMC is a duly certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation Government and recognized as a local tribal entity vested with the authority to review all matters affecting the community and to make appropriate recommendations to the Navajo Nation concerning matters that are in the best interest of the community; AND,
- 3. The Low Mountain Chapter finds that using the NNFRF for the LMC Cell Tower Project with CellularOne is in the best interest of the LMC community and the local Navajo Chapter membership and COVID-19 mitigation high priority for expanded telecommunication services for health standards, social services, wellbeing as the state of being happy, healthy, or prosperous; AND,
- 4. The Navajo Nation Broadband buildout plans is vital in that unserved and underserved local Navajo people can be adequately served to become connected and stay connected, communication for Schools, Public Safety, Hospital, and government, etc. are necessary for bridging the gap between our rural Chapter community and the Navajo Nation.
