RESOLUTION OF NAHATA DZIIL COMMISSION GOVERNANCE

NDCG-2023-03-024

Approving the Fiscal Recovery Fund Request Form and Expenditure Plan for Governance-Certified Chapters for a "Housing Wiring" Project in the Amount of \$237,600.

WHEREAS:

- The Nahata Dziil Commission Governance (hereinafter "NDCG") is certified by Navajo Nation Council Resolution CAP-36-91 as a local governmental entity of the Navajo Nation government which has the responsibility and authority to promote, protect and preserve the interest and general welfare including the safety of its community, people, programs, finances, property, etc.; and
- The Transportation and Community Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council by Resolution TCDCAU-66-02 approved governance certification of the NDCG pursuant to its Five Management System, in accordance with 26 N.N.C. § 102(B), and further authorized the NDCG to exercise local governmental authorities contained within 26 N.N.C. § 103 (D)(1); and
- On January 20, 2008, the Nahata Dziil Chapter converted its governmental entity and changed its name to the NDCG; and
- The Nahata Dziil community membership needs repairs to their homes such as roof repairs, electrical wiring, septic tank replacement, bathroom additions, etc.; and
- The Navajo Nation has unspent funds under the American Rescue Plan Act (hereinafter "ARPA"); and
- The NDCG has identified several projects and prepared the required Fiscal Recovery Fund Request Form in the amount of \$237,600 for a house wiring project (see attached Exhibit A); and
- The NDCG affirms that it will only use awarded Fiscal Recovery Funds and implement this FRF Expenditure Plan in compliance with the ARPA, ARPA Regulation, and with all applicable federal and Navajo Nation laws, regulation, and policies; and

8. The NDCG determines that the intent of this resolution is in the best interest of its community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The Nahata Dziil Commission Governance herebyapproves the Fiscal Recovery Fund Request Form and Expenditure Plan for Governance-Certified Chapters for a "Housing Wiring" project in the amount of \$237,600.
