## WHEREAS:

- 1. Mexican Springs Chapter is a certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation established and recognized by the Navajo Nation Council as a foundation of the Navajo Nation government vested with the authority to plan and implement projects in the nest interest of the community. See generally 2 N.N.C. §4021 et seq. and 26 N.N.C. §103; and
- 2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C. §102 (A), the Navajo Nation Council is governing body of the Navajo Nation; and
- 3. By resolution CAP-34-98, the Navajo Nation Council approved the "Local Governance Act", wherein the Navajo Nation Council delegated governmental authority to the Chapters of the Navajo to address matters of local concern with Navajo law, custom, and tradition; and
- 4. The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Fiscal Recovery Funds were allocated to the Navajo Nation to support our efforts to respond to the impacts of COVID-19, funds are allocated to develop our Nation's basic infrastructure and improve the lives of our Navajo citizens. Many citizens have always had to live without running water, clean drinking water, electricity and other basic services to support their daily activities, health and welfare; and
- 5. Pursuant to Navajo Nation Council resolution number CJY-41-21, approved the establishment of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund and the Expenditure authorization project thereunder, waiving certain provisions of the Navajo Nation Appropriations Act, Amending 12 N.N.C. § 334 to Authorize emergency procurements, authorizing reimbursement of the SIHASIN funds and undesignated unreserved fund balance, authorizing central support and regulatory cost funding, authorizing funding to complete defunded Navajo Nation CARES Fund Expenditure Plans,
