RESOLUTION OF THE MANUELITO NAVAJO CHAPTER

Supporting and approving the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) expenditure plan for the scattered electrical wiring of homes project in the amount of \$207,500 for Manuelito Chapter community.

WHEREAS:

- 1. N.N.C. Title 26 delegates Navajo Nation Chapters certain authority to review all matters affecting the community based on sound decision which are consistent with the Navajo Nation codes, laws, custom, and tradition; and
- 2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 1 (B) Manuelito Navajo Chapter is vested with the authority on all matters affecting the community, make appropriate actions when necessary and make recommendations to the Navajo Nation government and other federal/state/local agencies; and
- The Manuelito Navajo Chapter originally submitted ARPA proposals in the late summer of 2021 with one of them being the electrical wiring of homes in the amount of \$207,500; and
- 4. The Manuelito Navajo Chapter has determined that one of the infrastructure shortfall impacting homes during the COVID pandemic was lack of electricity to homes; and
- 5. The Manuelito Navajo Chapter would like to get as many homes connected to electrical powerline but homes must first be properly wired to receive energy to store medication, proper hygiene and storage, and telemedicine, working and fulfilling education obligations remotely via broadband and/or internet.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

Manuelito Chapter reaffirms, supports and approves the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) expenditure plan for its scattered electrical wiring of homes project in the amount of \$207,500 for Manuelito community.
