3. Pinedale Chapter affirms that the Chapter will only use awarded Fiscal Recovery Funds and implement this Fiscal Recovery Fund Expenditure Plan in compliance with the American Rescue Plan Act, American Rescue Plan Act Regulations, and with all applicable federal and Navajo Nation laws, regulations, and policies; **AND**

5. The Pinedale Chapter to educate the community members. Provide regular updates on the progress of FRF projects. Develop, maintain, and update appropriate social media platforms to provide timely and accurate information on the status of the Navajo Nation FRF projects; AND
6. The Pinedale Chapter will collect requests, expenditures plans and budgets to submit to Navajo Department of Justice (DOJ) for eligibility review; AND
7. The Pinedale Chapter will ensure the efficient management and be accountable for all funds provided to the Navajo Nation FRF office, including submitting financial reports, progress reports and preparing budgets; AND
8. The Pinedale Chapter will coordinate with outside entities on the planning, design, advertising, reporting, and contracting of FRF funding projects; AND
9. The Pinedale Chapter will develop and maintain a schedule of all FRF funded projects, monitor projects progress, and ensure that projects will be completed on time as not to forfeit any federal funding; AND

## NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. Pinedale Chapter will support and approve to accept the \$1,000,467.56 and additional funds allocated to Honorable Mr. Edmund Yazzie which he divides between his district chapter of six (6).
2. The funds of \$1,000,467.56 will be divided in the following:
  - a. \$733,528.56 – Purchase Manufacturing Homes
  - b. \$733,528.00 – Home Improvement for Major/Minor
 E. Other FRF funds are allocated between Mr. Honorable Edmund Yazzie will be applied for our community needs.
3. The Pinedale Chapter is receiving this ARPA/FRF allocation and its once in a lifetime opportunity to improve the quality of life for our people now and future generations.
