


Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Chapter 1: Navajo Nation Chapters, Section 1., (B) Purpose: (1) & (2), the Navajo Nation Council delegated to Chapter governmental authority with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo law, including custom and tradition and allows chapters to make decisions to govern with responsibility and accountability to community membership; and,
3. The Coalmine Canyon Chapter recognized that the financing of public project have become a major concern on the Navajo Nation and Nationally, therefore, the ARPA funding of 1,760,468.00 will be used according to some of the needs of our constitutes; and
