I am pleased to sign into law this resolution CJY-52-23 approving the Fiscal Recovery Funds Delegate Regional Project Plan for Honorable Damon's Delegate Region in the amount of \$8,802,340.

My Administration supports the plans of these Chapters who have worked very hard to put together their Regional Plans and is working very closely with the Fiscal Recovery Fund Office to ensure that these funds are put to use. As such, when Chapters are running into roadblocks in expending their Fiscal Recovery Funds and the roadblock is coming from the Executive Branch, I encourage them to reach out to the Office of the President and Vice President and inform my office of the roadblock and we will work to overcome those roadblocks.

I do want to take the moment to express my concern that any amendments to the Regional Plans must be approved by the Council. In addition, the prior Navajo Nation Council has set the expectation that Fiscal Recovery Funds be encumbered by June 30, 2024. This deadline is not far off. As a construction expert, I know that there are unpredictable factors that can prevent even the best of plans from moving forward on the proposed timeline. We should be designing systems that are flexible, accountable, and transparent. We do not currently have that system and I look forward to working with you and the entire Council to improve the Navajo Nation systems, so we are supporting our communities to take advantage of this historic funding.

Now let's get to work!

# RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 25<sup>th</sup> NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - FIRST YEAR, 2023

### AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE SETH DAMON'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: BÁÁHÁÁLÍ, CHICHILTAH, MANUELTITO, TSÉ ŁICHÍÍ, ROCK SPRINGS, TSAYATOH)

### BE IT ENACTED:

# SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- B. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the delegated responsibility to hear proposed resolution(s) that require final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, incorporated herein by reference, mandates that Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF") Delegate Region Project Plans be approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

# SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS; HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS; BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND ELECTRIC CAPACITY AND MANUFACTURED PROJECTS: HOUSING PROJECTS ADDITION PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION FACILITIES; BATHROOM CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on July 15, 2022.
- B. CJN-29-22, Section Three, states, in part and among other things, that

- 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation . . . . See CJN-29-22, Section Three (B).
- 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (D).
- 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate Region Project Plans. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (E).
- 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). See CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ initial eligibility determination. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (L)(5) and (L)(6).
- C. All projects listed in the Hon. Seth Damon's Delegate Region Projects Plan, attached as Exhibit A, have been deemed Fiscal

Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Seth Damon's Delegate Region Projects Plan does *not* exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).

D. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Hon. Seth Damon's Delegate Region Chapters and communities to approve and adopt the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Seth Damon's Delegate Region (Chapters: Bááháálí, Chichiltah, Manuelito, Tsé Łichíí, Rock Springs, Tsayatoh) as set forth in Exhibit A.

# SECTION THREE. APPROVAL OF HON. SETH DAMON'S DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Seth Damon's Delegate Region (Chapters: Bááháálí, Chichiltah, Manuelito, Tsé Łichíí, Rock Springs, Tsayatoh) set forth in **Exhibit A**.
- B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
- C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

# SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

# SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B), 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

# SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions

of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

Chapter Appendix A packets were prepared using the old forms and requirements under BFS-31-21. On May 9, 2023, the Navajo Nation Budget and Finance Committee passed BFMY-08-23 which amended certain appendices in BFS-31-21.

For purposes of this memorandum, the Appendix packet was changed in two ways: 1) the Appendix A form was updated; and 2) there is no longer a need that a Chapter resolution is required to be submitted containing a statement that the "Funding Recipient affirms that its receipt of Fiscal Recovery Funds and the implementation of this FRF Expenditure Plan shall be in accordance with Resolution No. CJY-41-21, the ARPA, ARPA Regulations, and with all applicable federal and Navajo Nation laws, regulations, and policies." This statement is incorporated into the new Appendix A form.

Currently, there are pending packets that used the old Appendix A form and/or lack the requisite Chapter Resolution. In the interest of time and given the effectiveness of BFMY-08-23, the FRF Office will resume the processing of pending packets despite it containing the old Appendix A form and/or the lack of the requisite Chapter Resolution. # RESOLUTION OF THE TSE' LICHII CHAPTER RRC-016-2023-005

Approving And Supporting Resolution #CIN-29-22 of the 24<sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council to have Red Rock (Tse'Lichii) Chapter implement the Rural Addressing Project: Requesting the Department of Justice(DOJ) to Develop an MOA and/or MOU with McKinley County, Geographic Information System (GIS) to accept the \$400,000.00 funds by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021.

# WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section I, (B, (1), (2) and Section 103, the Tse'Lichii Chapter is recognized as a local government entity and delegated certain authorities and responsibilities with respect to local matters consistent with Navajo Nation law; and
- 2. Pursuant to 2 N.N.C., Section 4028(a), the Tse'Lichii Chapter has the authority to review all matters affecting the community and make appropriate recommendations to the Navajo Nation, County and State government agencies; and
- 3. Because of the Covid-19 Pandemic, the United States passed Legislation ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) to allow the Navajo Nation is to support the COVID-19 public health and economic response by addressing COVID 19 and its support for public health; and
- 4. The passage of ARPA (American Rescue Plan is also to pay premium pay to eligible workers performing essential services and to make necessary investments in water, sewer and broadband infrastructure; and
- 5. The 14<sup>th</sup> Navajo Nation Council passed and approved Resolution CIN-29-22 which approved the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Expenditure Plans for chapter and regional projects and rural addressing, water and wastewater projects, broadband projects, home electricity connection, and bathroom additions projects; and
- 6. The Navajo Nation received \$211, 256,148 as a total allocation which is to be distributed equally between the 24 chapters; the total allocation to each chapter is \$8,892,240.
- 7. The Tse'Lichii Chapter adopted Resolution RRC-016-2022-024 which listed the ARPA priorities for the Tse'Lichii Chapter; furthermore, also adopted Resolution RRC -016-2022-028 which requested \$400,000 to complete the rural addressing project of the chapter; and
- 8. Efforts has been made by both the county and the chapter to identify addresses of the chapter members; however, it has not completed the project; and
- Most of the chapter members live in residences who do not have physical addresses and would be difficult to locate immediately so the chapter initiated the rural addressing project with McKinley County; and
- 10. It has been recommended to partner with McKinley County, Geographic Information System (GIS) to complete the rural addressing project; and
- 11. The partnership can be done through a Memorandum of Agreement and/or Memorandum of Understanding which can be drafted by the Navajo Nation Department of Justice.

# NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

In order to complete its rural addressing project, the Tse'Lichii Chapter is requesting that the Navajo
Nation Department of Justice develop an MOU/MOA with the McKinley County which will allow the
Tse'Lichii Chapter to accept the \$400,000 funds from the American Rescue Plan act (ARPA) of 2021 and
complete the project with McKinley County of the State of New Mexico.

WE, HEREBY, CERTIFY THAT THE FOREGOING RESOLUTION was duly considered at a duly-called meeting of the Tse'Lichii Chapter at which time a quorum was present and move to adoption on this 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 2022.
