RESOLUTION OF THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' STANDING COMMITTEE 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- First Year, 2023

AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; AMENDING NABIO-30-23 AND CJY-55-23 AND CAP-19-23 AND CD-68-22, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE ANDY NEZ, PH.D.'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: CRYSTAL, FORT DEFIANCE, RED LAKE, SAWMILL), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is established as a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 700(A).
- B. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, mandates that Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF") Delegate Region Project Plans be approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance.
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CD-68-22, included and incorporated herein by reference, mandated that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Honorable Andy Nez, Ph.D.'s Delegate Region (Chapters: Crystal, Fort Defiance, Red Lake, Sawmill) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) (17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C) (10), (11), and (12).
- D. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAP-19-23, included and incorporated herein by reference, mandated that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Honorable Andy Nez, Ph.D.'s Delegate Region (Chapters: Crystal, Fort Defiance, Red Lake, Sawmill) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).
- E. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJY-55-23, included and incorporated herein by reference, mandated that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Honorable Andy Nez, Ph.D.'s Delegate Region (Chapters: Crystal, Fort Defiance, Red Lake, Sawmill) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the

President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

- F. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAU-74-23, which amended CJN-29-22 and CJY-41-21, included and incorporated herein by reference, delegated the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as the final approval authority for Delegate Region Project Plans funded through Navajo Nation's Fiscal Recovery Funds.
- G. Naabik'íyáti' Committee Resolution No. NABIO-30-23, included and incorporated herein by reference, mandated that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Andy Nez, Ph.D.'s Delegate Region (Chapters: Crystal, Fort Defiance, Red Lake, Sawmill) be adopted and approved by resolution of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee pursuant to two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION Α. RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS: APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS; HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS; BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND ELECTRIC CAPACITY MANUFACTURED PROJECTS: HOUSING PROJECTS AND HOUSING FACILITIES; BATHROOM ADDITION PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on July 15, 2022.
- B. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three, now states, in part and among other things, that
 - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the

Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance. . . . See CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three (B).

- 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (D).
- 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate Region Project Plans. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (E).
- 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). See CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ initial eligibility determination. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (L)(5) and (L)(6).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CD-68-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE WILSON C. STEWART, JR.'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: CRYSTAL, FORT DEFIANCE, RED LAKE, SAWMILL), was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on January 6, 2023.
- D. CD-68-22, Section Four, states that:

- Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).
- E. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAP-19-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING CD-68-22 AND THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE ANDY NEZ, PH.D.'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: CRYSTAL, FORT DEFIANCE, RED LAKE, SAWMILL), was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on May 5, 2023.
- F. CAP-19-23, Section Four, states that:
 - Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).
- G. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJY-55-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING CAP-19-23 AND CD-68-22, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE ANDY NEZ, PH.D.'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: CRYSTAL, FORT DEFIANCE, RED LAKE, SAWMILL), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on August 4, 2023.
- H. CJY-55-23, Section Four, states that:
 - Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A) (17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).
- I. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAU-74-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS CJY-41-21 AND CJN-29-22; DELEGATING THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AS THE FINAL APPROVAL AUTHORITY FOR DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLANS FUNDED THROUGH THE NAVAJO NATION'S FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on September 6, 2023.

- J. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three, now states, in part and among other things, that
 - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance. . . . See CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three (B).
- K. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee Resolution No. NABIO-30-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; AMENDING CJY-55-23 AND CAP-19-23 AND CD-68-22, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE ANDY NEZ, PH.D.'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: CRYSTAL, FORT DEFIANCE, RED LAKE, SAWMILL), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION, was signed into law by the Chairperson of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee on October 17, 2023.
- L. NABIO-30-23, Section Four, states that:
 - 1. Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted and approved by resolution of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.
- M. All additional projects listed in the Hon. Andy Nez, Ph.D.'s Delegate Region Projects Plan, attached as Exhibit A, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Andy Nez, Ph.D.'s Delegate Region Projects Plan does not exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- N. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Hon. Andy Nez, Ph.D.'s Delegate Region Chapters and communities to approve and adopt the additional projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Andy Nez, Ph.D.'s Delegate Region (Chapters: Crystal, Fort Defiance, Red Lake, Sawmill) as set forth in Exhibit A.

SECTION THREE. AMENDING NABIO-30-23 AND CJY-55-23 AND CAP-19-23 AND CD-68-22, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION

PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE ANDY NEZ, PH.D.'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: CRYSTAL, FORT DEFIANCE, RED LAKE, SAWMILL), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION

The Navajo Nation hereby approves the additional projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Andy Nez, Ph.D.'s Delegate Region (Chapters: Crystal, Fort Defiance, Red Lake, Sawmill) set forth in **Exhibit A.**

- A. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
- B. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted and approved by resolution of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance.

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

Crystal MPB provides the facility for Chapter Administration, Navajo Nation Head Start and the Senior Center. It can offer showers, exercise space and meeting facilities when repair and maintenance is up-to-date. (See attached file)

Appendix A

a. Purchase materials and hire labor to complete maintenance & repairs for Crystal Chapter Multi-Purpose Building (MPB). Outsourced projects priorities include 1) HVAC replacements & repairs of furnaces and air conditioners; 2) concrete apron replacement -- MPB has incurred structural water damage due to slope of concrete and rain gutter leakage towards the base of the MPB foundation; 3) replace damaged sidewalks and areas where water is freezing into ponds for safety of Chapter members, especially the handicapped and elderly; 4) secure building with additional cameras and upgraded server; 5) light-pole bulb replacements; 6) replace roof caulking around exterior pipes and rock facade intersecting with metal roofing and other miscellaneous items. A more complete list of areas needing maintenance is attached.

Throughout COVID-19, the Chapter MPB was utilized to store, then distribute PPE and sanitation items to provide individuals with air-born and physical protection; water, bulk storage of nonperishable food to sustain members; and heating supplies such as wood, coal and wood pellets. The Chapter continues to store PPE to distribute during periodic reported increases with infections, and when requested by Chapter Members for safety measures. <u>The Crystal MPB is the hub for storage and distribution services for COVID related assistance for Crystal chapter members.</u>

b. The Crystal MPB will benefit the Navajo Nation, Crystal chapter members, children from surrounding communities attending Navajo Head Start, Seniors from Crystal and Navajo receiving lunch and activity participation and recipients of health care support from the CHR. Crystal MPB provides the facility for Chapter Administration, Navajo Nation Head Start, Navajo Nation Senior Center and CHR office. Once repairs and maintenance are up-to-date, it can provide showers, exercise space and meeting facilities. Crystal MPB opened to Chapter Members 10 years ego, September 2023. Since its initial opening no funds or labor resources were budgeted, then utilized to maintain an operable condition of the building other than Head Start maintenance.

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Crystal Chapter House Maintenance Repairs

- HVAC
 - Furnaces one furnace with settings that needs to be update, four furnaces removed and replaced, one external (not certain what it is) needs to be removed
 - Air Conditions there is no urgency to repair/replace Air Conditioners, but extra funds can be used for maintenance/repairs/replacements.
- Leaking
 - o main hall as well as throughout the MPB
 - Atrium on NE leaking down on side of rocks
 - Sr. Center above stove??
 - Sr. Center kitchen above windowed wall
 - Sr. Center Janitor closet (north of kitchen)
 - Replace caulking around all roofing pipes w/'silicone' caulking material Brutal Rubber expands and contracts with metal roofing, comes in matching metal roofing colors
 - o Re-caulk rain gutters
 - o Check valley where leaking occurred during winter storms
 - Snow tabs have fallen off all should be checked to make certain tight
- Mold
 - o Ceiling in Sr. Kitchen by front window
- Concrete !!!
 - Door entrances all concrete slopes towards the door entrances except front and Sr. Center doors
 - During extreme cold conditions, water is getting under the concrete, then freezing raising the height concrete at doors preventing entrance/exit !!! Safety Issue !!!
 - Back equipment exit door
 - Back Conference Room door
 - Main Hall door exit to water heater room
 - Past fall we first saw problems ground down concrete and door jams
 - o Back door (heavy equipment area) pond of water, eventually ice forms SAFETY
 - Head Start front door pond of water, then ice SAFETY
 - o Concrete Apron at least 80% of building has inward sloping concrete apron
 - o Most of the apron around the building is cracked, chipped & uneven
 - Front sidewalks are uneven and dangerous for Seniors and children, especially when it is dark
 - o Chicken wire visible around much of the stucco exterior along the base

·Locks/Doors

- o Sr. Kitchen back door requires lock replaced
- Conference Rm exterior door doesn't close tight for locking unless slammed from both sides
- o Front door is having problems closing tight now too
- Secure metal door to closet in CSC keys get locked in door cannot utilize a secure area w/safe
- EVERY exterior door needs maintenance
 - o All middle door seals replaced
 - o All bottom thresholds replaced
 - o Sr. Center Kitchen one back door needs the middle lock bar replace (I think)
 - o Interior mechanical room replace door sweeps too
 - o Check exterior Water Heater Room exterior door
 - o 16 (need to confirm) middle door seals height = 7' (112')

Structural

- Paint chipping looks like there was no primer applied chips showed up in 2014 photos
- o Large meeting hall
 - Two light fixtures need plastic covering replaced
- o Exercise Room
 - Two light fixtures need plastic covering replaced
- o Ceiling panels (15-20) need to be replaced in Main Hall, Exercise Rm and Sr. Center

Electric

- Replace light sensor on NE side of roof leaking into electrical room CHECK ROOF for source of leak
- 5 exterior lights w/new bulbs don't work
- Parking Lot light bulbs need replacement (waiting on quote from Navajo Electric)
- The east side <u>furnace</u> in the Main Hall is tied into the same circuit as at least half of the wall outlets of the Main Hall

Flooring

- Tile flooring throughout structure needs to be re-glued or replaced

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Safety

- Fire / Smoke Alarms need testing
- Cameras new computer terminal for recording (Personal opinion every room with exit door should have a camera) – ***did not evaluate Head Start
 - o 5+ new cameras should be installed inside & outside MPB
 - o Exterior areas include: Trash drop, NE side by entrance to water heater, outside exercise room

- Interior areas include: Front Conference room, Back conference room, back hall to fitness room, fitness room, Sr. Center
- o Personal opinion EVERY room with external access should have a camera
- Emergency Lighting checked (excluding Head Start)- Areas missing lighting attachment
 - Fitness Room
 - Back Hall

- Back Conference Room

- Interior Paint some hallways/rooms are due for updated paint job
- Exterior started in 2014 (photos)
 - o Rock façade around columns has broken/fallen off
 - o Paint on overhang for sidewalks needs to be repainted
 - Front Gate and fencing (fencing is falling apart on south side)
- Head Start school
 - o 4/20 Furnace not consistent, morning temp 50 degrees, at times blowing cold air
 - Back door water comes in slope of concrete outside door & rain/snow the rain gutter allows for water to come towards the concrete pad/entrance
 - o No trench for the rain gutter take-away across from back door
 - o Front door frozen pond, rain gutters are not caulked tight
 - o Would like tile at back door installed to replace carpet
 - o Exterior front-entry door has key lock problem

 - Leakage
 - Increase height of stove pipe outside
