Dear Speaker Curley,

I am pleased to sign into law this resolution CJY-65-23 approving the Fiscal Recovery Funds Delegate Regional Project Plan for Honorable Simpson's Delegate Region in the amount of \$4,600,557.

My Administration supports the plans of these Chapters who have worked very hard to put together their Regional Plans and is working very closely with the Fiscal Recovery Fund Office to ensure that these funds are put to use. As such, when Chapters are running into roadblocks in expending their Fiscal Recovery Funds and the roadblock is coming from the Executive Branch, I encourage them to reach out to the Office of the President and Vice President and inform my office of the roadblock and we will work to overcome those roadblocks.

I do want to take the moment to express my concern that any amendments to the Regional Plans must be approved by the Council. In addition, the prior Navajo Nation Council has set the expectation that Fiscal Recovery Funds be encumbered by June 30, 2024. This deadline is not far off. As a construction expert, I know that there are unpredictable factors that can prevent even the best of plans from moving forward on the proposed timeline. We should be designing systems that are flexible, accountable, and transparent. We do not currently have that system and I look forward to working with you and the entire Council to improve the Navajo Nation systems, so we are supporting our communities to take advantage of this historic funding.

Now let's get to work!

RESOLUTION OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - FIRST YEAR, 2023

AN ACTION

RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING CMY-42-23, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE DANNY SIMPSON'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: BECENTI, LAKE VALLEY, NAHODISHGISH, STANDING ROCK, WHITEROCK, HUERFANO, NAGEEZI, CROWNPOINT), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. § 102(A).
- B. The Naabik'fyati' Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council with the delegated responsibility to hear proposed resolution(s) that require final action by the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(9).
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, incorporated herein by reference, mandates that Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF") Delegate Region Project Plans be approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).
- D. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CMY-42-23, herein by reference, mandates that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Honorable Danny Simpson's Delegate Region (Chapters: Becenti, Lake Valley, Nahodishgish, Standing Rock, Whiterock, Huerfano, Nageezi, Crownpoint) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

A. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS;

HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS; BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND ELECTRIC CAPACITY PROJECTS: HOUSING PROJECTS AND MANUFACTURED HOUSING FACILITIES: BATHROOM ADDITION PROJECTS: CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on July 15, 2022.

- B. CJN-29-22, Section Three, states, in part and among other things, that
 - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation . . . See CJN-29-22, Section Three (B).
 - 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (D).
 - 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate Region Project Plans. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (E).
 - 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two thousand

- three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). See CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ initial eligibility determination. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (L)(5) and (L)(6).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CMY-42-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE DANNY SIMPSON'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: BECENTI, LAKE VALLEY, NAHODISHGISH, STANDING ROCK, WHITEROCK, HUERFANO, NAGEEZI, CROWNPOINT), was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on June 8, 2023.
- D. CMY-42-23, Section Four, states that:
 - 1. Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).
- E. All additional projects listed in the Hon. Danny Simpson's Delegate Region Projects Plan, attached as Exhibit A, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Danny Simpson's Delegate Region Projects Plan does not exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- F. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Hon. Danny Simpson's Delegate Region Chapters and communities to approve and adopt the additional projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Danny Simpson's Delegate Region (Chapters: Becenti, Lake Valley, Nahodishgish, Standing Rock, Whiterock, Huerfano, Nageezi, Crownpoint) as set forth in Exhibit A.

SECTION THREE. AMENDING CMY-42-23, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE DANNY SIMPSON'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: BECENTI, LAKE VALLEY, NAHODISHGISH, STANDING ROCK, WHITEROCK, HUERFANO, NAGEEZI, CROWNPOINT), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the additional projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Danny Simpson's Delegate Region (Chapters: Becenti, Lake Valley, Nahodishgish, Standing Rock, Whiterock, Huerfano, Nageezi, Crownpoint) set forth in Exhibit A.
- B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
- C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10),(11), and (12).

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B), 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.



Crownpoint Community Land Use Planning Committee (CLUPC) Regular Meeting Minutes October 28, 2022 10:00AM

- I. Meeting Call to Order: Leonard Perry, CLUPC President called the meeting to order at 10:08 AM which was held via teleconference and with a quorum present.
- II. Invocation was provided by Rita Capitan. Introduction: CLUPC Members included Leonard Perry, Angela Charley and Rita Capitan. Other meeting attendees included: Michael Salabiye, Senior Planner for NN Division of Behavioral and Mental Health; Rick Yazzie, Continental Divide Coop; Victor Lopez, Continental Divide Coop; Daryl Dineyazhe-Toya, Acting IHS CEO Crownpoint Service Unit IHS; Orlando Johnson, Management and Program Analyst; Margorie Werito, HPDP Manager; Brenda Tahe, Supervisory Health System Specialist; Aaron Etcitty, Crownpoint Community Service Coordinator; Felicia Singer, Administrative Maintenance Specialist; and Lisa Chee, IHS Health Promotion Specialist.
- III. Review/Acceptance of the Agenda: Leonard Perry reviewed the agenda with attendees. Rita Capitan made a motion to approve the agenda and added Housing Development on Fee Land, along with update on the NN Emergency Medical Service Facility Update to Old Business. Seconded by Angela Charley. Vote: 3 in favor, 0 opposed & 0 abstained.

At this point, Mr. Lopez of Continental Divide stated that the Three Phase Line which was mentioned at last month's meeting runs thru N11 Road, west of Crownpoint and extends to the Crownpoint. Rita Capitan ask if that Three Phase was enough to hold the electrical power needed for Crownpoint. Mr. Lopez stated that it should be enough to work for Crownpoint. Mr. Perry then stated that we need to not only look at the present situation of development, but we have to keep in mind that future development, such as the hotel project, c-store and laundromat, NN DBMS modular building, EMS facility, NTU development, future housing development and others will be forthcoming.

Old Business: Atta Capitan stated that APRA funds was be utilized for the ½ acre homesite lease sites on the fee land west of West Mesa Housing. Three Hundred Thousand was on the APRA list for this project. Leonard Perry state that he and Harold Slim from the NN Land Department in Crownpont, talked to Ms. Irene Ecitty who lives in the proposed housing development, and was told that there are others in her family who have homesite leases there. Mr. Perry stated that Mr. Slim did find the homesite lease locations and made a map of the area. Mr. Perry stated he will send that map to Mrs. Capitan. Mr. Perry also stated that Mr. Slim was to make a draft of ½ acre homesite leases in the proposed area.

Rita Capitan ask the current status of the one acre site for NN Emergency Medical Service Facility and Land Withdrawal. Mr. Perry stated that Raylene Charley will be contacted for the updates on the land withdrawal and the EMS facility project.

Updates and Community Planning and Discussion:

a. Crownpoint Community Utility and Services Update and Future Services
Discussion/Housing Demolishment Projects

1. IHS Housing Demonlishment Project

Daryl Dineyazhe-Toya, Acting IHS CEO, stated that the south quarters of the IHS housing units have a replacement design in place. The funding for this project was awarded in August of 2021. The kickoff for this project was in September of 2021. The Scope of Work states that 32 units will be replaced. The facilities will be energy efficient and will be of today's standards. The design includes RV spaces. The new units will aid in the retention of staff and employees. The project will be up for bid for 2023 construction. There is concern on the water embankment on the south side of this project.

Leonard Perry informed the IHS crew that this housing project in on Executive Order 1359, and that the BIA is to be involved in the continued project work. The water embankment is also on Executive Order 1359, but the threat of the Dam located there is not much of a concern now because it has been breached.

Daryl Dineyazhe-Toya made the statement that her administration wishes to improve communication with the Crownpoint community.

Rita Capitan ask if the Crownpoint Chapter and the IHS administration could meeting pertaining to the services provided at IHS Health Care facilities in Crownpoint, if a meeting could be set up before the November Chapter Regular Meeting.

Daryl Dineyazhe-Toya said yes, there is a day a meeting can be set up.

Leonard Perry ask about the plans of further development on the IHS compound as the former IHS CEO, Anselm Roamhorse, talked of additional buildings being located on the IHS land tract.

Margorie Werito stated that there is a planning stage for a modular building on the east side of the hospital for diabetes programs, such as individual teaching and some fitness training programs. It may be open to the public, but it will not be as big as what is at Navajo Technical University.

Leonard Perry explained the land status in which IHS facilities are located on, including Executive Order 1359 and the NTT on the

northinge. The differences between the two with federal CFR and the NN Land Department requirements.

Rita Capitan taiked of the three buildings that are being requested to be demonstrated: the old public safety building, the former head start office, and the abandoned wellness center near IHS. The current Wellness Center recently built was for IHS usage too.

Daryl Dineyazhe-Toya said she will follow up on the abandoned wellness center near IHS and will help in the removal.

2. Update on NN Division of Behavioral and Mental Health Modular Building Mike Salabiye reported that the proposed building to be placed on the 2.5 acre site south of IHS is funded by APRA funds. They are working thru CPMD and there is no timeline yet. The outpatient facility will include a traditional healing ground, hogan, sweat lodges, which has the nature of halfway houses. The design is still needed and then the cost estimate. The foundation will be permanent. Also, the NN Department of Justice requires we go through CPMD requirements, and we are in the process of hiring an individual as a project manager.
