- During critical disasters or crisis, the Many Farms Chapter identified the need for E.911
 and Rural Addressing Infrastructure. The COVID-19 pandemic and associated economic
 crisis have illustrated the challenges of rapidly deploying resources to the most urgent; and
- 4. Rural Addressing will provide the tools and resources to the Department of Public Safety, Emergency Responders, and the United Postal Services; and
- Establishing the E.911 and Rural Addressing within the community will strongly support improving and increasing the mapping, deployment and adoption of identifying Street Addresses.
