THE STEAMBOAT COMMISSION GOVERNMENT IS ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE ARPA - NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR CHAPTER WATERLINE EXTENSION PROJECT AND CHAPTER WAREHOUSE PROJECT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,700,000.00 FOR THE NEEDS OF STEAMBOAT COMMUNITY.

WHEREAS:

- Pursuant to TCDC Resolution TCDYMT-60-03; Steamboat Chapter is a Local Governance Act ("LGA")
 certified Chapter authorized to exercise certain governance authorities contained within 26 N.N.C. §
 103, with the exception of land administration authority pursuant to 26 N.N.C. § 103 (D) (I); and
- 2. Pursuant to Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CO-51-04, Steamboat Chapter is a Governance Certified Chapter authorized to exercise certain authorities within 26 N.N.C; and
- The Steamboat Chapter is delegated to act within its authority to review all local matters affecting the
 community members consistent with the Navajo Nation law, including custom and tradition which
 compel the chapter to govern with the reasonability and accountability to the community members;
 and
- 4. The Steamboat community approved on August 23, 2011 an Alternative Form of Government to change to Commission-Manager Style Government; and
- 5. The Steamboat Commission Government has a short- and long-term Strategic Plan in place to address issues regarding economic, business, community development, industrial park, and social needs within the community; and
- 6. The Steamboat Commission Government accepts the allocations for the ARPA NNFRF allocation in the amount of \$1,700,000.00 for Water line extension project and Warehouse Project; and
- 7. The Steamboat Commission Government supports and accepts the Expenditure Plan to serve Steamboat Community for needs of adequate water supply for homes and a location on the chapter compound to house PPEs, Food supply, and other supplies. (Attachment Appendix A); and
- 8. The Steamboat Commission Administration will be the point of contact on all administrative matters.



C, Purpose:

- 1.) Steamboat Chapter has been receiving high quantity of PPE, MRE, Cleaning Supplies, Bottled Water, Dry Food, Water Containers, and extra supplies to combat the Corona Virus 19. Steamboat Chapter has been utilizing their Assembly Room (800 sq. ft.), Office Supply Room (240 sq. ft.) and the Multi-Purpose Lobby (120 sq. ft.) as a permanent storing area, congested and unsafe but the only spaces that are available at this time.
- 2.) Steamboat Community has 20 miles of gravel road, 14 miles of MAG road, and 4 miles with soil stabilizer and 12 miles of dirt road which is all maintained by Apache County District 2 Region 3 periodically. Another 64 miles of dirt road is all maintained by NOOT (8IA) which is all dirt (twice a year). During inclement weather and the dirt roads gets impassible, the community members, they will utilize the warehouse as an overnight shelter.
- 3.) 60% of household in Steamboat Community is multi family oriented or overcrowded, with no extra space or room to isolate any of their family member(s) when they get infected with Corona Virus 19, the major reason why the Positive cases is so high on the Navajo Nation, and this Warehouse will serve as a perfect facility to isolate our infected family members to get well until they get cleared by IHS Case Worker.

Steamboat Chapter has secured 3 quotes from outside vendors [will be updated] for 40ft x 70ft pre-fabricated metal warehouse that will meet the needs of the Chapter House.
