25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- Second Year, 2024

AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE OTTO TSO'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTER: TO' NANEES DIZI)

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is established as a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 700(A).
- B. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, mandates that Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF") Delegate Region Project Plans be approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance.
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAU-74-23, which amended CJN-29-22 and CJY-41-21, included and incorporated herein by reference, delegated the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as the final approval authority for Delegate Region Project Plans funded through Navajo Nation's Fiscal Recovery Funds.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS; HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS; BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND ELECTRIC CAPACITY PROJECTS; HOUSING PROJECTS AND MANUFACTURED HOUSING FACILITIES; BATHROOM ADDITION PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on July 15, 2022.
- B. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three, now states, in part and among other things, that
 - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from

DELEGATING THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AS THE FINAL APPROVAL AUTHORITY FOR DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLANS FUNDED THROUGH THE NAVAJO NATION'S FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on September 6, 2023.

- D. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three, now states, in part and among other things, that
 - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance. . . . See CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three (B).
- E. All projects listed in the Hon. Otto Tso's Delegate Region Projects Plan, attached as Exhibit A, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Otto Tso's Delegate Region Projects Plan does not exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- F. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Hon. Otto Tso's Delegate Region Chapters and communities to approve and adopt the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Otto Tso's Delegate Region (Chapter: To' Nanees Dizi) as set forth in Exhibit A.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL OF HON. OTTO TSO'S DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Otto Tso's Delegate Region (Chapter: To' Nanees Dizi) set forth in Exhibit A.
- B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
- C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by

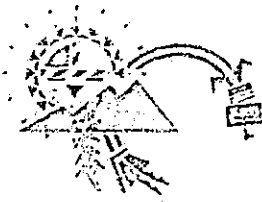

Dear Mr. Platero,

On November 20, 2023, I received an email from Ms. Leonora Henderson, Senior Programs and Projects Specialist for the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Office, stating that "DOJ would like to know what the \$300,000.00 Tuba City Domestic Violence Shelter Facility project (request) is" since two projects have already been submitted for design and construction.

\$300,000.00 ARPA Funds Request for Design and Construction:

An application for the request of ARPA funds was submitted for \$300,000.00 to pay for the design on the Tuba City Domestic Violence Shelter. This proposed funding of \$300,000.00 was identified and allocated by Honorable Otto Tso for this specific project.

\$200,000.00 ARPA Funds Request for Furniture, Fixture and Equipment:

An application to request for \$200,000.00 ARPA funds was also submitted to pay for Furniture, Fixture, and Equipment (FF&E). This is to use after the project is completed.


\$3,000,000.00 ARPA Funds Request for Design and Construction:

After the two applications were submitted for the total amount of \$500,000.00, I learned that the Tuba City Domestic Shelter project was going to cost at least \$6.6 million dollars. I explained to and conferred with Director Thomas Cody, Navajo Division of Social Services, the construction cost of \$6.6 million and he recommended that I submit a \$3 million ARPA application to help cover the remaining construction cost. It is understood that the \$3 million fund would not be automatically available since this funding is still being finalized.

I hope this clarifies why Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation submitted two applications on the design and construction of the Tuba City Domestic Violence Shelter project.

Re: Fee proposal – Domestic Violence Shelter

Julius,

Dekker/Perich/Sabatini is pleased to submit this proposal for professional services for the above referenced project. We understand the scope of the project to be creating a shelter for domestic violence victims that is located close to the judicial complex in Tuba City, AZ. The 2.5 acre site for the project is currently occupied by an old courthouse building that will need to be demolished. The site also has an existing Hogan building that will remain and be incorporated into the design of the shelter complex. This proposal is based on a concept plan that was provided by DPS on July 24, 2023 that included 6 units total. 5 units have 4 beds and 1 unit has 6 beds for larger families. The units share a toilet core, but each unit has a bathroom for privacy. There is a main building that has 6 offices, conference room, kitchen, dining and living room. Total building area in this concept is 8,200 square feet.

Design services will include typical basic services including DD, CD and CA phase support for architectural, MEP, and structural engineering.

Professional service scope description:

Schematic Design and Programming:

The schematic design will consist of further refining the concept plan that was sent on July 24, 2023. We will work with the owner's representatives to develop the operational concepts of the shelter to further define the functional program. Schematic floor plans, site plan and building elevations will be developed and narratives of the structural and MEP systems will be the final deliverables of this phase.

Design development phase:

Based on the Owner's written approval to proceed and approval of the designs presented in the Schematic Design. The Design Development Documents shall illustrate and describe the development of the approved Schematic Design Documents and shall consist of drawings and other documents including plans, sections, elevations, typical construction details, and diagrammatic layouts of building systems to fix and describe the size and character of the Project as to architectural, structural, mechanical, plumbing, electrical systems, and outline

We will review and approve the Contractor's required submittals such as Shop Drawings, Product Data and Samples, to check for conformance with the Contract Documents and Specifications. Defects, deficiencies or other corrections to submittals will be reported to the Contractor.

We will review and respond to requests for information (RFI) concerning the Contract Documents. Our response to such requests will be made in writing with reasonable promptness. If appropriate, we will prepare and issue supplemental Drawings and Specifications in response to RFI.

We may authorize minor changes in the Work that are consistent with the intent of the Contract Documents and do not involve an adjustment in the Contract Sum or an extension of the Contract Time.

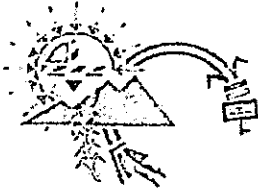
Progress payments are invoiced monthly based on our percentage of completion. Payments are due and payable thirty (30) days from the date of invoice. Dear Honorable Tso,

As you may be aware, Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation (TCRHCC) has taken the lead in overseeing the Tuba City Domestic Violence Shelter project.

On August 07, 2023, Ms Joette Walters, TCRHCC CEO, and I met with you on this project, and you had mentioned that we could seek at \$500,000.00 from the Division of Community Development ARPA funding to assist Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation with its Tuba City Domestic Violence Shelter project.

The Navajo Nation Division of Social Services received \$4.1 million to construct this Tuba City Domestic Violence Shelter facility. Unfortunately, the funding that was awarded is not enough to design and construct this facility.

Therefore, I am respectfully requesting an additional \$500,000.00 to pay for the Design and Construction cost. The design fees will be \$300,000.00 and the remaining \$200,000.00 could go towards the construction cost.

The cost for construction for this much needed facility in Tuba City, Arizona is estimated at \$6,300,000.00. The Tuba City Chapter has agreed to pay for demolition of the old Tuba City Courthouse, which has been designated as the new site for the Tuba City Domestic Violence Shelter.

Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation has partnered with Tuba City Chapter and Navajo Division of Social Services on this project.

Your favorable approval in supporting this needed service in Western Agency would greatly be appreciated.

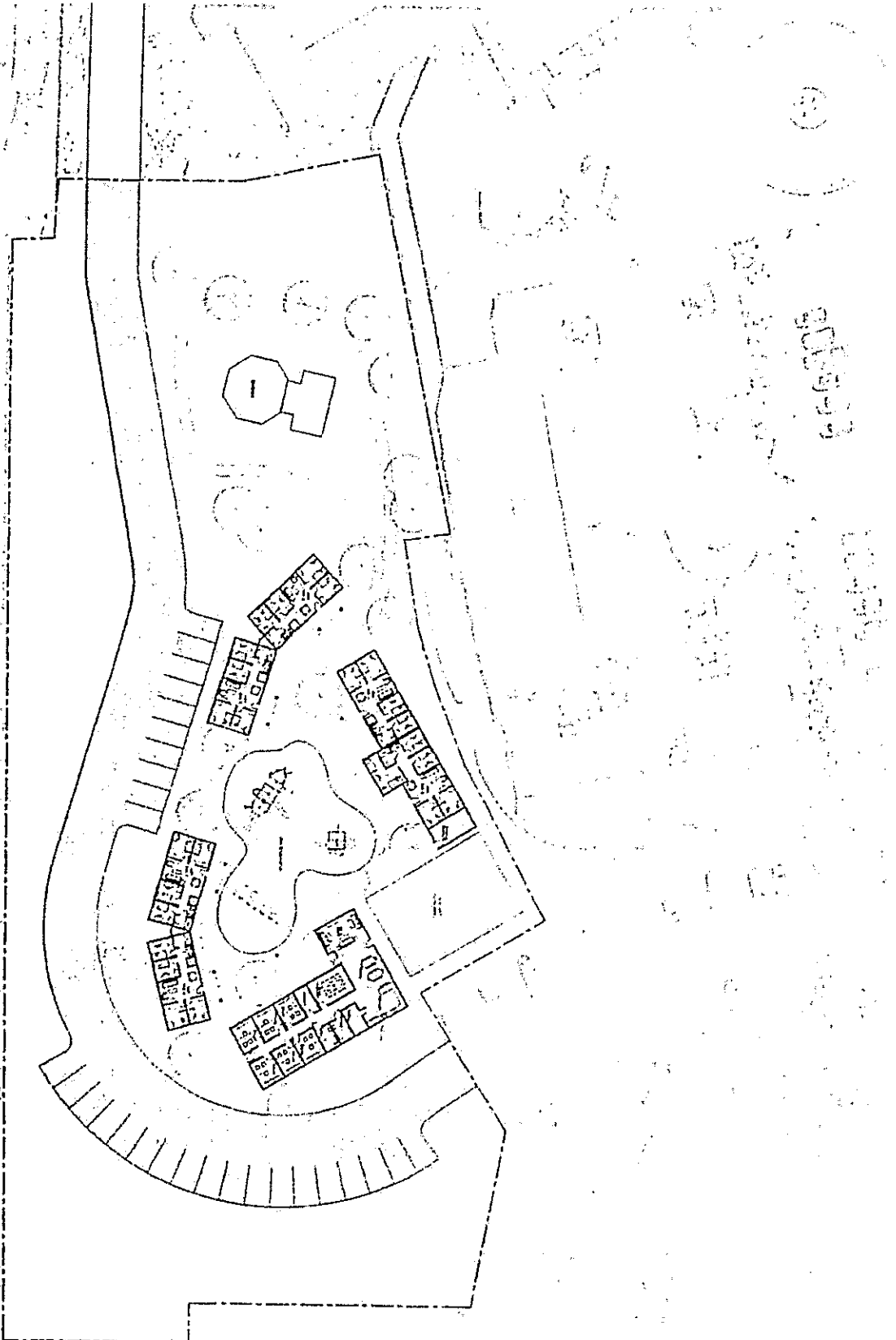

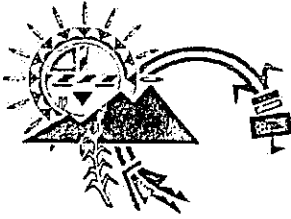

**RESOLUTION OF THE
TUBA CITY REGIONAL HEALTH CARE CORPORATION
BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

**TO THE NAVAJO NATION GOVERNMENT TO REQUEST THREE MILLION
DOLLARS FROM FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS OF THE AMERICAN RESCUE
PLAN ACT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SHELTER
FACILITY**

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJY-33-10 (July 21, 2010) and Naabik'iyáti Committee Resolution NABID 96-18 (Dec. 27, 2018), TCRHCC is authorized and designated as a "Tribal Organization" for the purpose of managing and operating contracts with the Indian Health Service ("IHS") under the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act, Public Law 93-638, as amended ("ISDEAA"); *and*
2. Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation (TCRHCC), a non-profit, 501(c)3, tribal organization as defined in the Indian Self-Determination Act, Public Law 93-638; *and*
3. The TCRHCC service area within the Western Navajo Agency and Coconino County communities including Cameron, Bodaway/Gap, Coalmine Canyon, Kaibeto, LeChee, Coppermine, Tonalea, and To'Naneez'Dizi Chapters, and including the Hopi Village of Moenkopi and the San Juan Southern Paiutes of Tuba City, *and*
4. The TCRHCC Regional Health System with a primary patient service population of nearly 36,000 also serves as a Medical Referral Center for over 100,000 patients across the Navajo Nation, including Hopi and San Juan Southern Paiutes. TCRHCC is also the largest referral center serving the Navajo Nation; *and*
5. The TCRHCC has a need to identify, strengthen and develop future health and supportive services and strategies which will benefit elders, family and child services, and other specialty areas including health facilities; *and*
6. TCRHCC will expand services by constructing a Domestic Violence Shelter Facility in Tuba City, *and*
7. TCRHCC will establish partnerships, on-board new staff and develop a victim service protocol and a sustainability plan; *and*
8. TCRHCC will provide comprehensive case management and mental health services to adults and children affected by domestic violence and human trafficking.

RELATING TO NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; ACCEPTING THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE AND GRANTING THE DESIGNATION OF "TRIBAL ORGANIZATION" TO THE TUBA CITY REGIONAL HEALTH CARE CORPORATION FOR A PERIOD OF FIFTEEN (15) YEARS, FOR THE PURPOSES OF CONTRACTING WITH THE UNITED STATES INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE AND AUTHORIZING THE TUBA CITY REGIONAL HEALTH CARE CORPORATION INC. TO NEGOTIATE AND ENTER INTO TITLE I, INDIAN SELF-DETERMINATION ACT (P.L. 93-638, AS AMENDED) CONTRACTS AND TITLE V SELF GOVERNANCE COMPACTS PURSUANT TO THE INDIAN SELF-DETERMINATION ACT (P.L. 93-638, AS AMENDED), SUCH DESIGNATION OF "TRIBAL ORGANIZATION" BEING REVOCABLE AND CONTINGENT ON CONTINUING COMPLIANCE WITH ALL TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS APPROVED BY THE HEALTH, EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE OF THE NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. Pursuant to Navajo Nation Council Resolution CJY-33-10 and the Navajo Nation Code at 2 N.N.C. Section Five (5) "References to previous Standing Committees" which states in part "References in the Navajo Nation Code...to Government Services and Intergovernmental Relations Committees shall mean the Naabik'iyáti' Committee..." See Exhibit No. 1.
- B. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council exercises the authority to authorize and approve additional tribal organizations that have received the recommendation and approval of the Health, Education and Human Services Committee of the Navajo Nation Council. See Exhibit No. 1.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation has requested to be designated a "tribal organization" for a period of twenty-five (25) years, for the purposes of contracting with the United States Indian Health Service and to negotiate and enter into Title I, Indian Self-Determination Act (P.L. 93-636, as amended) contracts and Title V Self Governance Compacts pursuant to the Indian Self-Determination Act (P.L. 93-638, as amended). As found within Exhibit No. 2.

Section Three. Approval

- A. The Naabik'iyáti' Committee of the Navajo Nation Council, upon approval and recommendation of the Health, Education and Human Services Committee (Committee), hereby approves giving the Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation the revocable designation of "tribal organization" for a period of fifteen (15) years for the purposes of contracting with the United States Indian Health Service and to negotiate and enter into Title I, Indian Self-Determination Act (P.L. 93-638, as amended) contracts and Title V Self Governance Compacts pursuant to the Indian Self-Determination Act (P.L. 93-638, as amended) and subject to the continuing compliance with the Terms and Conditions as approved and adopted by the Health, Education and Human Services Committee attached hereto as Exhibit No. 3 and also as found at Exhibit B within Exhibit No. 2.

CERTIFICATION
