APPROVING THE SAWMILL CHAPTER ARPA PRIOIRTY LISTING IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,733,662.00 FOR THE CHAPTER MOTOR GRADER AS TOP PRORITY AND OTHER ESSENTIAL PROJECTS ATATCHED AS EXHIBIT "A"

WHEREAS:

- 1. Pursuant to the "Local Governance Act" 26 N.N.C., chapter 1, subchapter 1, section 3(a). The Sawmill Chapter is continued as a certified chapter of the Navajo Nation Government, by the Navajo Nation Council Resolution; and
- 2. Pursuant to the chapter 1, subchapter 1, section 131 (1); (2), of the same "Act", the Sawmill Chapter has the responsibility and authority to promote, protect and preserve the interest and general welfare including the safety of its community people; and
- 3. The Sawmill Chapter is invested to review all matters affecting the community to make favorable decisions in the best interest over local matter; such as cultural preservation, economic development safety and welcome of chapter membership; and
- 4. The Sawmill Chapter has developed an ARPA funding priority list for various community program/programs and now has the chapter motor grader as its top priority; and
- 5. The Sawmill Chapter has participated in numerous Legislative District Meetings with its other three (3) sister chapters (Red Lake, Crystal and Fort Defiance), and with the 24th Navajo Nation Council Delegate Wilson Stewart Jr., in the development of ARPA Grant Funding Application/Projects; and
- 6. Under the Navajo Nation ARPA, each council legislative district was allocated \$8.8 Million for use in their Districts/Chapters and other entities and the Council Delegate is to present projects with recommendations from the chapters; and
- 7. Sawmill Chapter has submitted a letter from its Chapter President stating its revised ARPA Priority Listing in the amount of \$1,733,662.00 attached as Exhibit "A"; and
- 8. It would be in the best interest of Sawmill Chapter that 25th Navajo Nation Council Delegate, Honorable Dr. Andy Nez advocate and submit the Sawmill Chapter ARPA Priority Listing for funding as soon as possible.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Sawmill Chapter hereby approve and submit its ARPA Grant Funding Priority List as Exhibit "A"
- 2. The Sawmill Chapter hereby respectfully request of its Honorable Dr. Andy Nez, 25th Navajo Nation Council Delegate to accept, advocate and submit for ARPA Grant Funding as soon as possible:
