Approving the Selection of Warehouse, Waterline and Bathroom Addition Projects for Funding by the American Rescue Plan Act

WHEREAS:

- 1. Fort Defiance Chapter is a duly certified chapter of the Navajo Nation, pursuant to Navajo Nation Code Two, Sections 4001 and 4006, with authority to address and take action on the needs and concerns of its people, and
- 2. Fort Defiance Chapter was governance-certified on January 15, 2016, which provides autonomy in its structure and governance, and
- 3. The U.S. Government allocated funds to mitigate the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic for improvement of health, education, safety and general welfare of the people, and
- 4. There is a major need for infrastructure and other needs which indicates an alarming number of people who still live without domestic water and inside bathroom. They have to haul water from any source available, and
- 6. There was a huge amount of PPE, food, water, clothing, blankets, wood, bedding, that required safe storage. In addition, a warehouse could have serviced more people to stay as they were evacuated or those could not return home due to the bad weather, and
- 7. Fort Defiance Chapter has several heavy equipment and its implements which lack storage to avoid vandalism, destruction or damage by the weather and needs a warehouse to prolong its longevity, and
- 8. Fort Defiance Chapter has identified the following projects and requests the Navajo Nation to honor the following projects for approval for funding using the American Rescue Act Plan (ARPA) funds:

A. Bathroom Addition \$500,000.00 \$1,070,301.00 B. Warehouse C. Waterline \$200,000.00

NOW THEREFORE BE RESOLVED THAT:

Fort Defiance Chapter hereby approves the selection of a bathroom addition, warehouse and waterline projects for funding by the Navajo Nation Office of Fiscal Recovery Funds; said projects to be included in Dr. Andy Nez's region.

SCATTERED WATERLINE EXTENSION PROJECT

FORT DEFIANCE CHAPTER

INTRODUCTION

In early times, residents of Fort Defiance did not have potable water for domestic use; they hauled water from natural springs or from water wells available in distant locations. In the winter times when roads were impassable, people would gather snow or ice, melt them and then use for cooking and meager washing. When snow melts through heating, there was some water. When snow begins to melt around the house, people would haul snow from long distances on their backs and use the melted snow for cooking and washing. The hauled water could be contaminated.

Hauling water, mostly with wagons and horses, gave way to a new system in 1959 when a water system was introduced in Fort Defiance area. Wells were constructed and pumps to storage tanks where it was treated, maintained by the Navajo Tribal Utility Authority.

The Navajo Nation leadership and chapters are encouraging and advocating for agricultural farming for self-sufficiency and healthful living. Dine people have always in the past depended on farming to sustain their livelihood. Added to the need for domestic use, Dine people have animals which need water to survive.

STATEMENT OF NEED AND IMPACT

"Water Is Life" is true. Dine people reveres water. Water is always mentioned and treated as sacred in the prayers, songs, traditional ceremonies, and is a crucial element by the Dine belief; all living things require water.

GOAL OF THE PROJECT

The goal of this project is to assist community people to obtain potable water in their homes so that they may enjoy the convenience of safe drinking water and have water available for their animals and for farming.

OBJECTIVES

Fort Defiance Chapter will conduct needs assessment of people in the area to determine who actually do not have water in their homes.

BUDGET

Assessment by NTUA will be used.

EVALUATION

The general process used by NTUA or other will be utilized.

COMPLETION REPORT

Project Manager of the chapter will work with companies to close out the project, with the assistance by the chapter manager, officials and Navajo Nation programs involved.
