**APPROVING THE APPENDIX A, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS REQUEST FORM AND EXPENDITURE PLAN FOR MEXICAN WATER CHAPTER'S CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW WAREHOUSE PROJECT FOR STORAGE OF PPE's, WATER, WOOD, COAL, FOOD AND HEAVY EQUIPMENT.**

### WHEREAS,


1. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 102 (B); which permits Mexican Water Chapter to exercise local governance authorities contained within 26 N.N.C. Section 103, with the exception of land administration authority pursuant to 26 N.N.C. Section (D) (1); and
2. Pursuant to 26 N.N.C., Section 3 (A) the Mexican Water Chapter is a recognized certified Chapter of the Navajo Nation government, as listed at 11 N.N.C. part 1, section 10; and
3. Pursuant to CAP-34-98, the Navajo Nation Council adopted the Navajo Nation Local Governance Act (LGA); and
4. The Mexican Water Chapter is requesting funding from the ARPA funding pool in the amount of \$1,267,200.00 for a 3 Bay 50' by 80', 4,000 square feet warehouse; the funds will be used for the construction of a new warehouse for the secure storage of PPEs, water wood, coal, food and other valuable asset; and to mitigate the COVID-19 Pandemic; and
5. The current Mexican Water Chapter warehouse is in dilapidated condition, the roof is leaking and is located at the old chapter property in Arizona; and
6. The Mexican Water Chapter is requesting the new warehouse to be built on Mexican Water Chapter property in Utah; and
7. The Mexican Water Chapter will advertise through the Navajo Times newspaper for an invitation for bid to potential vendors operating on and off the Navajo Nation, announcing a Competitive Sealed Bidding.


### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT;

1. The Mexican Water Chapter hereby approves Appendix A, the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Funds Request Form and Expenditure Plan for Mexican Water Chapter's construction of a new warehouse project for the requested funding amount of \$1,267,200 for a 3 Bay 50' by 80', 4,000 square feet warehouse; attached as Appendix "A".
2. The Mexican Water Chapter Administration will be responsible for the implementation of the warehouse project and to maintain the operation and its maintenance cost.
3. The Mexican Water Chapter Administration shall initiate the Construction of the New Warehouse Project in Fiscal Year 2023, and the estimated date of completion of the project will be before December 31, 2026.



#### JUSTIFICATION:

##### WATER:

There will be water or no water to the new Metal Warehouse Facility, depending on the Chapter's preference. Safety measures are in place to prevent or aide in the safety system will be installed according to Risk Management and NFPA Requirements. In addition, restroom facilities are located in the Chapter and near the Warehouse Facility.

##### OPERATIONS:

Please take notice that hours of operations and heavy equipment traffic is limited to 8 am to 5 pm and only as requested by community members and Chapters. It is rare that heavy equipment is operation at its full function of 8 am to 5 pm, Monday thru Friday.
