RESOLUTION OF THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' STANDING COMMITTEE 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL - - SECOND YEAR, 2024

AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; AMENDING NABIF-10-24 AND CJY-54-23 AND CMY-41-23, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE LOMARDO ASERET'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: KLAGETOH, WIDE RUINS, HOUCK, TSÉ SI' ÁNI, NAHATA DZIIL)

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is established as a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 700(A).
- B. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, mandates that Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF") Delegate Region Project Plans be approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance.
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CMY-41-23, included and incorporated herein by reference, mandated that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region (Chapters: Klagetoh, Wide Ruins, Houck, Tsé Si' Áni, Nahata Dziil) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C)(10), (11), and (12). See Exhibit 1 (without project exhibits).
- D. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJY-54-23, included and incorporated herein by reference, mandated that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region (Chapters: Klagetoh, Wide Ruins, Houck, Tsé Si' Áni, Nahata Dziil) be approved by a Navajo Nation Council resolution and signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C)(10), (11), and (12).
- E. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAU-74-23, which amended CJN-29-22 and CJY-41-21, included and incorporated herein by reference, delegated the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as the final approval authority for Delegate Region Project Plans funded through Navajo Nation's Fiscal Recovery Funds.

F. Naabik'íyáti' Committee Resolution No. NABIF-10-24, included and incorporated herein by reference, mandated that amendments to the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region (Chapters: Klagetoh, Wide Ruins, Houck, Tsé Si' Áni, Nahata Dziil) be adopted and approved by resolution of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee pursuant to two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS; HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS; BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND ELECTRIC CAPACITY PROJECTS; HOUSING PROJECTS AND MANUFACTURED HOUSING FACILITIES; BATHROOM ADDITION PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on July 15, 2022.
- B. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three, now states, in part and among other things, that
 - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance . . . See CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three (B).
 - 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (D).

- 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate Region Project Plans. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (E).
- 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). See CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ initial eligibility determination. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (L)(5) and (L)(6).
- C. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CMY-41-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE LOMARDO ASERET'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: KLAGETOH, WIDE RUINS, HOUCK, TSÉ SI' ÁNI, NAHATA DZIIL), was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on June 8, 2023.
- D. CMY-41-23, Section Four, states that:
 - 1. Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).
- E. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJY-54-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING CMY-41-23, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY

FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE LOMARDO ASERET'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: KLAGETOH, WIDE RUINS, HOUCK, TSÉ SI' ÁNI, NAHATA DZIIL), TO INCLUDE ADDITIONAL PROJECTS FOR THIS DELEGATE REGION was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on August 4, 2023.

- F. CJY-54-23, Section Four, states that:
 - 1. Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005 (C) (10), (11), and (12).
- G. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAU-74-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS CJY-41-21 AND CJN-29-22; DELEGATING THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AS THE FINAL APPROVAL AUTHORITY FOR DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLANS FUNDED THROUGH THE NAVAJO NATION'S FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on September 6, 2023.
- H. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three, now states, in part and among other things, that
 - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance. . . . See CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three (B).
- I. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee Resolution No. NABIF-10-24, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; AMENDING CJY-54-23 AND CMY-41-23, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE LOMARDO ASERET'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: KLAGETOH, WIDE RUINS, HOUCK, TSÉ SI' ÁNI, NAHATA DZIIL) was signed into law by the Chairperson of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee on February 15, 2024.
- J. NABIF-10-24, Section Four, states that:

- 1. Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted and approved by resolution of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.
- K. The Hon. Lomardo Aseret has requested to amend CMY-41-23 to remove the Klagetoh Chapter Illegal Dumpsite Remediation (Greasewood Road) Project (under NNDOJ Review No. HK0378) from his Delegate Region Projects Plan enacted under CMY-41-23, which originally appropriated \$100,000.00 for this project. The removal of this project will revert \$100,000.00 back to Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Project Plan's Un-Allocated Amount.
- L. The Hon. Lomardo Aseret has requested to amend CMY-41-23 to remove the Klagetoh Chapter Demolition and Rehabilitation of Old B.I.A. Compound Project (under NNDOJ Review No. HK0496) from his Delegate Region Projects Plan enacted under CMY-41-23, which originally appropriated \$200,000.00 for this project. The removal of this project will revert \$200,000.00 back to Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Project Plan's Un-Allocated Amount.
- M. The Hon. Lomardo Aseret has requested to amend CMY-41-23 to remove the Klagetoh Chapter A.R.P.A. Projects Consultant (under NNDOJ Review No. HK0497) from his Delegate Region Projects Plan enacted under CMY-41-23, which originally appropriated \$50,000.00 for this project. The removal of this project will revert \$50,000.00 back to Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Project Plan's Un-Allocated Amount.
- N. The Hon. Lomardo Aseret has requested to amend CMY-41-23 to increase the project's funding amount for the Klagetoh Chapter Renovation of Chapter House Project (originally under NNDOJ Review No. HK0381) by \$350,000.00 to his Delegate Region Projects Plan enacted under CMY-41-23, which originally appropriated \$827,774.00 for this project. A revised Navajo Nation Department of Justice Eligibility Determination (now under NNDOJ Review No. HK0381-2) increased the project's funding amount and adjusted the project's funding amount to \$1,177,774.00.
- O. All projects listed in the Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Projects Plan, attached as **Exhibit 2**, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Projects Plan does not exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section

Three (F).

P. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Chapters and communities to approve and adopt the projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region (Chapters: Klagetoh, Wide Ruins, Houck, Tsé Si' Áni, Nahata Dziil) as set forth in Exhibit 2.

SECTION THREE. AMENDING NABIF-10-24 AND CJY-54-23 AND CMY-41-23, THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE LOMARDO ASERET'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTERS: CHAPTERS: KLAGETOH, WIDE RUINS, HOUCK, TSÉ SI' ÁNI, NAHATA DZIIL)

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the **removal** of the *Klagetoh Chapter Illegal Dumpsite Remediation (Greasewood Road) Project* (under NNDOJ Review No. HK0378) in Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Projects Plan enacted under CMY-41-23, which appropriated \$100,000.00 for this project and is **stricken** in **Exhibit 2**. The removal of this project will **revert \$100,000.00** back to Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Project Plan's **Un-Allocated Amount**.
- B. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the **removal** of the *Klagetoh Chapter Demolition and Rehabilitation of Old B.I.A. Compound Project* (under NNDOJ Review No. HK0496) in Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Projects Plan enacted under CMY-41-23, which appropriated \$200,000.00 for this project and is **stricken** in **Exhibit 2**. The removal of this project will **revert** \$200,000.00 back to Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Project Plan's **Un-Allocated Amount**.
- C. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the **removal** of the *Klagetoh Chapter A.R.P.A. Projects Consultant* (under NNDOJ Review No. HK0497) in Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Projects Plan enacted under CMY-41-23, which appropriated \$50,000.00 for this project and is **stricken** in **Exhibit 2**. The removal of this project will **revert** \$50,000.00 back to Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Project Plan's **Un-Allocated Amount**.
- D. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the increase to the project's funding amount for the Klagetoh Chapter Renovation of Chapter House Project (originally under NNDOJ Review No. HK0381) by \$350,000.00 in Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region Projects Plan enacted under CMY-41-23, which originally appropriated \$827,774.00 for this project and this increase is identified

in **Exhibit 2.** A revised Navajo Nation Department of Justice Eligibility Determination (now under NNDOJ Review No. HK0381-2) increased the project's funding amount and **adjusted** the project's funding amount to \$1,177,774.00.

- E. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the projects as part of the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region (Chapters: Klagetoh, Wide Ruins, Houck, Tsé Si' Áni, Nahata Dziil) set forth in Exhibit 2.
- F. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
- G. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted and approved by resolution of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance.

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

As such, when Chapters are running into roadblocks in expending their Fiscal Recovery Funds and the roadblock is coming from the Executive Branch, I encourage them to reach out to the Office of the President and Vice President and inform my office of the roadblock and we will work to overcome those roadblocks.

I do want to take the moment to express my concern that any amendments to the Regional Plans must be approved by the Council. In addition, the prior Navajo Nation Council has set the expectation that Fiscal Recovery Funds be encumbered by June 30, 2024. This deadline is not far off. As a construction expert, I know that there are unpredictable factors that can prevent even the best of plans from moving forward on the proposed timeline. We should be designing systems that are flexible, accountable, and transparent. We do not currently have that system and I look forward to working with you and the entire Council to improve the Navajo Nation systems, so we are supporting our communities to take advantage of this historic funding.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL OF HON. LOMARDO ASERET'S DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Lomardo Aseret's Delegate Region (Chapters: Klagetoh, Wide Ruins, Houck, Tsé Si' Áni, Nahata Dziil) set forth in Exhibit A.
- B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.
- C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted by resolution of the Navajo Nation Council and approval of the President of the Navajo Nation pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17) and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to 2 N.N.C. § 221(B), 2 N.N.C. § 164(A)(17), and 2 N.N.C. §§ 1005(C)(10), (11), and (12).

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions

of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

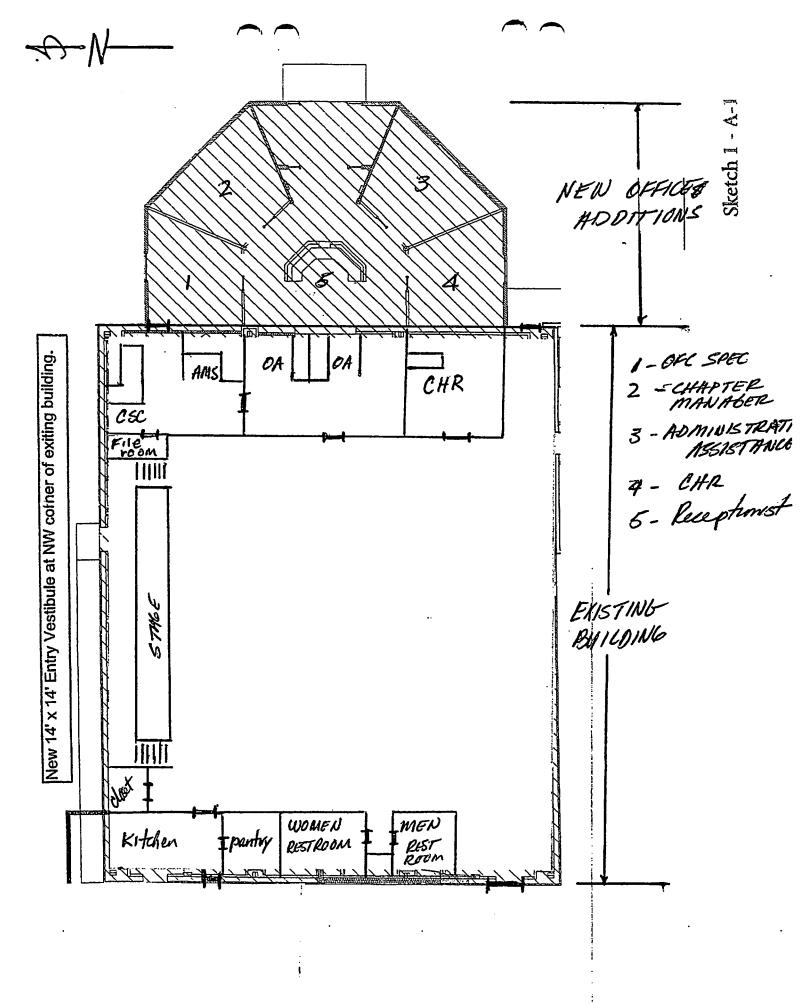

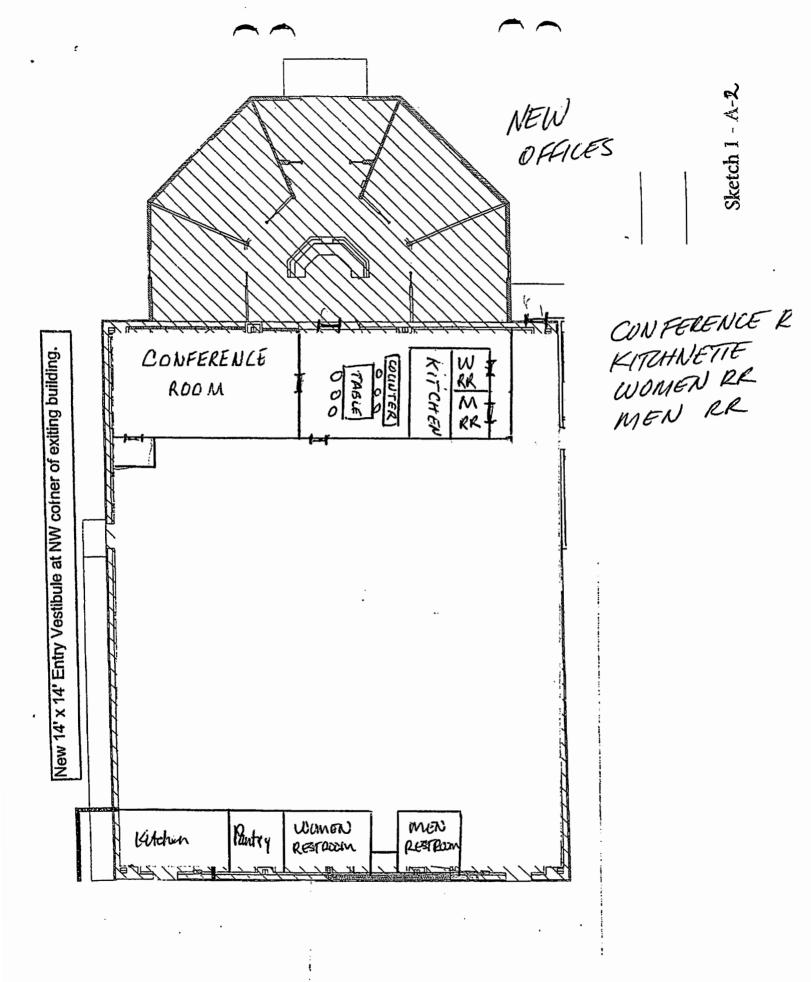

Klagetoh Chapter has six ARPA projects totaling \$1,760,468.00: Rural Addressing \$100,000.00, Project Consultant \$50,000.00, Illegal Dumpsite \$100,000.00, Veterans Housing \$482,693.71, BIA Compound \$200,000.00, and Chapter Renovation \$827,774.29.

The BIA Compound and Illegal Dumpsite remediation has been idling due to concerns from Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency (NNEPA) Resource, Conservation & Recovery Program. Klagetoh Chapter hope to keep this project moving forward with assistance from NNEPA and NNDCD. These two projects will require environmental clearances that take time to get approvals and will not be ready for the June 30th deadline.

ARPA Project Consultant, since the Klagetoh Chapter is using the NNDCD on-call services offered to non-certified chapters and with assistance from Indigenous Design the chapter representatives agreed that ARPA Project Consultant is not needed.

With this said, Klagetoh Chapter is requesting \$350,000.00 be transferred to Renovation/Construction of Klagetoh Chapter house which is in dire need of complete upgrade. The Chapter's lagoon needs upgrading: berms around the pond needs to be build back up, trees growing on berm needs clearing, berms need grading, inside lagoon needs cleaning, sewer line from chapter has been clogged for the last two years with the restroom out of order. The chapter needs a conference room for privacy when conversing with community members and meetings. The front roof is covered with tin panels and is leaking, the whole roof needs to be replaced.

To meet the CDC guidelines, the Community Building needs to have, and HVAC system installed to properly circulate the air inside the building and allow for fresh air to be introduced to the building periodically. The existing structure does not have "barriers" to prevent direct contact with individuals in the main office. As a result, the community members are asked to remain on the exterior of the building and the Chapter Staff provide services through what was a standard window. For the safety of the chapter staff and community members using the community building, it is important to renovate the main office section to have a pass-through window and other features recommended for public buildings by the CDC and other organizations. Its also important to renovate other areas such as the restrooms, kitchen, podium, entrance/exits, and the main meeting room so it meets CDC guidelines for public meeting spaces.

(b) Explain how the Program or Project will benefit the Navajo Nation, Navajo communities, or the Navajo People:

During times of inclement weather, the Community Building serves as the Emergency Operations Center when weather related emergencies are declared. When the Community Building is being used during declared emergencies, it is also used to provide shelter for community members whose homes become inaccessible. The Community Building also serves as the meeting facility for those families who may have lost loved ones. The aforementioned are some of the necessary activities and services provided to the community of Klagetoh. The renovation of this building will essentially serve the entire community and beyond for many more years.

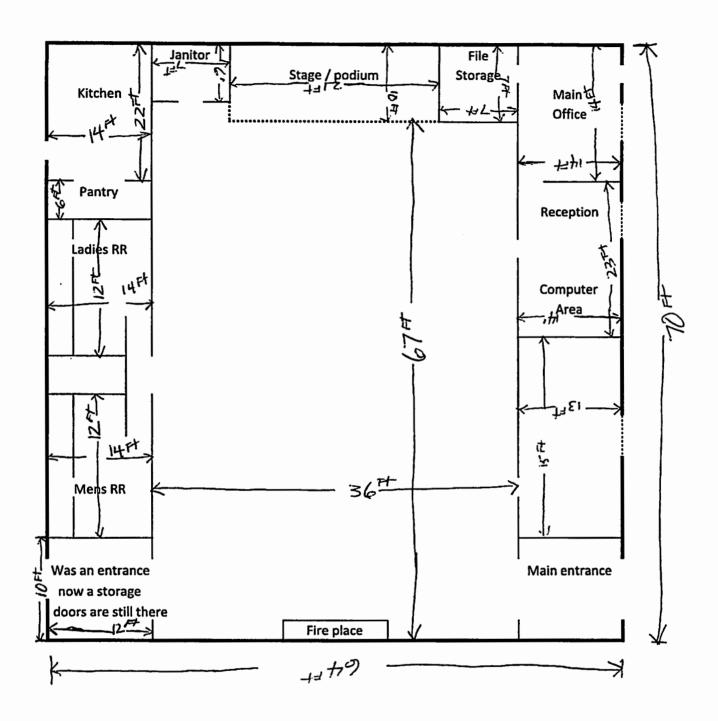
