Broadband/Cellular Tower is identified to be installed (18) miles East of Many Farms Chapter (N38°19' 41.00" W108° 25' 11.00"). There are approximately 2,500 community members who reside within the area and building a tower at this location would provide access to telephone and high-speed broadband services. The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic has defined the need for access to Internet services for work and distance learning, and when schools switched to distance learning in March 2020, the majority of the families living in this particular area lacked access to services which resulted in severely affecting the connectivity of students and homework bound.

WIRELESS ASSESSMENT

Smith Bagley, Inc., Cellular One

October 20, 2022

Smith Bagley, Inc., has conducted an initial engineering study of two proposed wireless facility locations, which are identified as Many Farms east and Many Farms north. Both site locations are approximately 6 - 8 miles north of the Chapter House with access from hwy 191.

Both proposed sites would include the installation of a permanent 120'+ tower and support 4G-LTE wireless services, connected by future fiber optic cable.

With the completion of these two facilities, mobile and fixed 4G wireless services will be extended into the north Many Farms area.

The initial proposed budget for each tower project, pre-sales tax is as follows:

\$28,000	Soft costs - site acquisition/permitting/eng.
\$85,000	Tower manufactured and delivered
\$210,000	Construction (foundation work)
\$260,000	RBS (Radio network)
\$103,000	Backhaul/utilities
\$8,000	Integration
\$56,000	Site BOM (bill of materials)
\$750,000	Total

The total projected cost for both tower sites on air and in service is \$1,500,000.

9. Pursuant to 28 N.C. § 103(D) (1), the Resources and Development Committee certified Many Farms Chapter as Governance Certified, who shall exercise authority pursuant to 28 N.C. § 103, with exceptions of Land Administration Authority beginning February 28, 2012; and
10. Many Farms Chapter as a duly recognized tribal government entity shall receive funds through the Navajo Nation Council CARES Act Fund Expenditures; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Many Farms Chapter hereby supports and approves the Many Farms Chapter members' request to establish reliable cellular service, electricity, and wireless fidelity for the District # 10 community; and
2. The Many Farms Chapter urges the chapter staff to proceed and expedite the necessary procedures to enable the construction and installation of infrastructure to support cellular service, electricity, and wireless fidelity for the enrolled District # 10 members, who are deprived of said service.
