RESOLUTION OF THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' STANDING COMMITTEE 25th NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL -- Second Year, 2024

AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN FOR HONORABLE EUGENIA CHARLES-NEWTON'S DELEGATE REGION (CHAPTER: SHIPROCK)

BE IT ENACTED:

SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY

- A. The Naabik'íyáti' Committee is established as a standing committee of the Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 700(A).
- B. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, mandates that Fiscal Recovery Fund ("NNFRF") Delegate Region Project Plans be approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik fyáti Committee members in attendance.
- C. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAU-74-23, which amended CJN-29-22 and CJY-41-21, included and incorporated herein by reference, delegated the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as the final approval authority for Delegate Region Project Plans funded through Navajo Nation's Fiscal Recovery Funds.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CJN-29-22, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; ALLOCATING \$1,070,298,867 OF NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION FISCAL RECOVERY FUND EXPENDITURE PLANS FOR: CHAPTER AND REGIONAL PROJECTS; PUBLIC SAFETY EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS, E911, AND RURAL ADDRESSING PROJECTS; CYBER SECURITY; PUBLIC HEALTH PROJECTS; HARDSHIP ASSISTANCE; WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS; BROADBAND PROJECTS; HOME ELECTRICITY CONNECTION AND ELECTRIC CAPACITY PROJECTS; HOUSING PROJECTS AND MANUFACTURED FACILITIES; BATHROOM ADDITION PROJECTS; CONSTRUCTION CONTINGENCY FUNDING; AND REDUCED ADMINISTRATIVE FUNDING, was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on July 15, 2022.
- B. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three, now states, in part and among other things, that

- 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'iyati' Committee members in attendance. . . . See CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three (B).
- 2. The Delegate Region Project Plan funding will be allocated to the Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, to implement the projects rather than directly to the Chapters. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (D).
- 3. The Navajo Nation Central Government, specifically the Division of Community Development or other appropriate Navajo Nation Division or Department, shall manage and administer funds and Delegate Region Project Plans on behalf of Non-LGA-Certified Chapters. The Navajo Nation Central Government may award funding to LGA-Certified Chapters through sub-recipient agreements to implement and manage specific projects, but shall maintain Administrative Oversight over such funding and Delegate Region Project Plans. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (E).
- 4. Each Navajo Nation Council delegate shall select Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible projects within their Delegate Region to be funded by the NNFRF Chapter and Regional Projects Expenditure Plan through a Delegate Region Projects Plan. The total cost of projects selected by each Delegate shall not exceed their Delegate Region distribution of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340). See CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- 5. Each Delegate Region Project shall identify its Administrative Oversight entity and its Oversight Committee(s) and be subject CJY-41-21's NNDOJ initial eligibility determination. See CJN-29-22, Section Three (L)(5) and (L)(6).

- C. The Navajo Nation Council Resolution No. CAU-74-23, AN ACTION RELATING TO THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AND NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; AMENDING COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS CJY-41-21 AND CJN-29-22; DELEGATING THE NAABIK'ÍYÁTI' COMMITTEE AS THE FINAL APPROVAL AUTHORITY FOR DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLANS FUNDED THROUGH THE NAVAJO NATION'S FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS was signed into law by the President of the Navajo Nation on September 6, 2023.
- D. CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three, now states, in part and among other things, that
 - 1. The Navajo Nation hereby approves total funding for the NNFRF Chapter and Chapter Projects Expenditure Plan from the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund in the total amount of two hundred eleven million two hundred fifty-six thousand one hundred forty-eight dollars (\$211,256,148) to be divided equally between the twenty-four (24) Delegate Regions in the amount of eight million eight hundred two thousand three hundred forty dollars (\$8,802,340) per Delegate Region . . and allocated through Delegate Region Project Plans approved by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'íyáti' Committee members in attendance . . . See CJN-29-22, as amended by CAU-74-23, Section Three (B).
- E. All projects listed in the Hon. Eugenia Charles-Newton's Delegate Region Projects Plan, attached as Exhibit A, have been deemed Fiscal Recovery Fund eligible by NNDOJ. In addition, Hon. Eugenia Charles-Newton's Delegate Region Projects Plan does not exceed the amount of \$8,802,340, as set forth in CJN-29-22, Section Three (F).
- F. The Navajo Nation Council hereby finds that it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation and the Hon. Eugenia Charles-Newton's Delegate Region Chapters and communities to approve and adopt the Navajo Nation Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Eugenia Charles-Newton's Delegate Region (Chapter: Shiprock) as set forth in Exhibit A.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL OF HONORABLE EUGENIA CHARLES-NEWTON'S DELEGATE REGION PROJECT PLAN

- A. The Navajo Nation hereby approves the Fiscal Recovery Fund Delegate Region Project Plan for Hon. Eugenia Charles-Newton's Delegate Region (Chapter: Shiprock) set forth in Exhibit A.
- B. The Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall comply with all applicable provisions of CJY-41-21, CJN-29-22, and BFS-31-21.

C. Any inconsistencies between this legislation, the Delegate Region Project Plan, and the individual project appendix, shall be resolved in favor of the project appendix reviewed by Department of Justice during their eligibility determination(s).

SECTION FOUR. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to this legislation or to the Delegate Region Project Plan approved herein shall only be adopted and approved by resolution of the Naabik'iyati' Committee.

SECTION FIVE. EFFECTIVE DATE

This legislation shall be effective upon its approval pursuant to two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Naabik'iyati' Committee members in attendance.

SECTION SIX. SAVING CLAUSE

If any provision of this legislation is determined invalid by the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, or by a Navajo Nation District Court without appeal to the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, those provisions of this legislation not determined invalid shall remain the law of the Navajo Nation.

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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

The undersigned natural persons, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States and enrolled members of the Navajo Nation, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the Navajo Nation Corporation Code, hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

A REPORT OF

The name of the corporation is Shiprock Community Development Corporation and its period of duration is perpetual. ARTICLE II.

The place in the Navajo Nation where the principal office of the Corporation is to be located is:

Northern Navajo Agency Programs Administration Complex Southwest Corner of U.S. Rt. 64 & Navajo Rt. 103, Lane 1 Shiprock, Navajo Nation, NN 87420

ARTICLE III

- A. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are exclusively charitable and educational and consist of the following:
 - (1) To improve the community physically, socially, and economically by the coordinated efforts of its citizens. (1) To improve the community physically, socially, and thus promoting the general welfare while lessening the burdens of government.
 - (2) To develop low-cost decent, safe and sanitary housing for low-income residents of the Shiprock community including those whose incomes are below federal poverty guidelines and who would not otherwise be able to find or afford a suitable dwelling, and to assist in the humane relocation of displaced families.
 - (3) To provide information and technical assistance to the residents of Shiprock community including those whose incomes are below federal poverty guidelines or below the median income for the community, concerning the methods and resources available for the rehabilitation of dilapidated residential housing, so that the physical condition of such housing might be improved to provide decent, safe and sanitary dwellings for low- and moderate-income residents of Shiprock. The corporation is also formed for the educational purposes of instructing the low- and moderate-

income residents of Shiprock in certain "self-help" methods of housing rehabilitation, which will improve or develop the capabilities of the community.

- (4) To own and operate on an at-cost basis housing units for residents of Shiprock including those whose incomes are below federal poverty guidelines or below the median income for the community and who would not otherwise be able to afford a suitable place to live. Additionally, to provide at-cost management services for these low- and moderate-income units, designed to maintain the physical condition and social environment of these units, thus combatting the deterioration of the community.
- (5) To create opportunities for community members who are unemployed, underemployed, or whose income is below federal poverty guidelines to manage and operate business enterprises in economically depressed areas and to assist these people in developing entrepreneurial, management and self-sufficiency skills necessary for the successful operation of business enterprises.
- (6) To provide grants, loans, guarantees or other arrangements to individuals or organizations working to develop the community, and to enter into lawful agreements to secure and enforce the performance and payments obligations of such financial assistance.
 - (7) To organize citizens and groups to combat crime through effective cooperation with law enforcement and other and other governmental organizations.

This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person.

ARTICLE VI

Provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the Corporation shall be set forth in the bylaws of the Corporation. The authorized number and qualifications of members of the corporation, the classes of membership, if any, and the property, voting and other rights and privileges of the members shall be as set forth in the bylaws and the liability for dues and assessments and the method of collection, if any, shall be as set forth therein.

ARTICLE VII

A. This corporation is not organized nor shall it be operated for pecuniary profit and no part of this corporation's income or assets shall ever inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to any director, officer or member of this corporation or to the benefit of any private individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered. The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable and public purposes.

B. On the dissolution or winding up of this corporation, its assets remaining, after payment of, or provision for payment of, all debts and liabilities of this corporation, shall be distributed to a nonprofit corporation incorporated under Chapter Three (3) of the Navajo Nation Corporation Code and which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and/or public purposes and that has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE VIII

A. This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law, or (ii) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

B. No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or attempting to influence legislation, nor shall this corporation participate in or intervene (including the publishing or distribution of statements) in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for political office.

ARTICLE IX

The corporation shall abide by all criminal; civil and regulatory laws of the Navajo Nation.

AMENDED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

SHIPROCK COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

The undersigned natural persons, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States and enrolled members of the Navajo Nation, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the Navajo Nation Corporation Code, hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is Shiprock Community Development Corporation (hereinafter Corporation) and its period of duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE II

The principal office location of the Corporation is: Mesa Farm Rd, Navajo Route 364, Plot 282-A Shiprock, NM 87420

ARTICLE III

The purpose of the Corporation is to help renew the well-being and prosperity of the Shiprock community by honoring the richness of its culture and history through collective actions. The goal of the Corporation is to develop strong relationships to sustain an economically, environmentally, and culturally healthy community.

The operations and functions of the Corporation shall encompass the following activities:

- 1. To improve the economic development of the local community by developing partnerships and assisting with coordinated efforts
- 2. To support the development of safe and affordable housing for residents of the Shiprock community, including low-income housing
- 3. To promote and create opportunities for community members to manage and operate successful small businesses
- 4. To provide technical assistance and training to support and improve the community including revitalization projects and re-development of obsolete land uses
- To initiate and support planning for historic cultural preservation, community beautification, demolition and clean-up projects

ARTICLE IV

The registered agent is:

Kyle Jim, Highway 64, Dineh Housing, PO Box Shiprock, NM 87420

ARTICLE V

The incorporators of the Corporation are:

Betty Ojaye, PO Box , Shiprock, NM 87420
Joe Smart, PO Box , Shiprock, NM 87420
Fannie L. Atcitty, PO Box Shiprock, NM 87420
Kyle Jim, PO Box , Shiprock, NM 87420

ARTICLE VI

Provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the Corporation shall be set forth in the bylaws of the Organization, including the authorized number and qualifications of members of the Corporation and voting and other rights and privileges of the members.

ARTICLE VII

This corporation is not organized nor shall it be operated for pecuniary profit and no part of this corporation's income or assets shall ever be inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to any director, officer or member of this corporation or to the benefit of any private individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered. The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable and public purposes.

ARTICLE VIII Prohibited Activities

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda or attempting to influence legislation, nor shall this corporation participate in or intervene (including the publishing or distribution of statements) in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for political office.

ARTICLE IX Dissolution

Upon the dissolution of the Organization, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all the legal liabilities of the Organization, assets shall be distributed to a non-profit corporation incorporated under Chapter Three (3) of the Navajo Nation Corporation Code and which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and/or public purposes and that has established its tax exempt status under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE X

The Corporation shall abide by all criminal, civil and regulatory laws of the Navajo Nation.

We declare that we are the persons who amended the above Articles of Incorporation, and that this instrument is our act and deed: Adopted and approved on July 23, 2020.
